

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit." (John 15:1)

If we're not trimmed down, our pride will grow, our selfishness will expand and become bloated, but we won't grow.

Our growth doesn't have to come through pain, but we can try to distract our self-intake by being concerned about others. Listening to and remembering someone else's current problems is not too painful and it puts us in shape. We become more "beautiful", compassionate, patient and understanding.

And the best part of this struggle is that we are not alone. We may cut back sometimes but we're still part of the vine: Christ. Branches have certain advantages: they simply have to put to use the food and strength that come from the vine.

But we have obligations too. Christ doesn't expect miracles from us, but wants us to try, with his help, to reach out to others. The vine won't extend without the branches. And wherever the branches show up, the vine is appreciated or not according to the goodness of the branches. The Jewish Christians had a hard time deciding whether to accept Paul or not. But Paul proved he was joined to the vine by speaking out fearlessly in the name of Jesus, and worrying more about the gospel then his own welfare.

It's not that easy staying in shape as Christians. We have to accept pain and disappointment. We have to listen more to others then we do to ourselves. We die a little each day to make room for the Risen life. And ultimately, as Christians we look forward to the final death, the last shedding of the human bulk. But death will be a real joy: the end of sin, the end of struggling, and the new permanently trim us. If we try trimming down our selfishness, we learn in advance what it means to die: dying to self, but rising to Christ.

Christ died to give us life – not in small proportion, but life abundantly. For this I will promise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people.

### The Precepts of the Church.

In addition to the Ten Commandments given by God to Moses as found in the Old Testament (Exodus 20:2-17 and Deuteronomy 5:6-21) that oblige Jews and Christians to this very day, the Catholic Church has established its own set of particular commandments or "precepts" that bind the baptized Catholic faithful. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains:

The Precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayers and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor (The Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2041).

## The Precepts of the Church are as follows:

- 1. Attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation
- 2. Confession of serious sin at least once a year
- 3. Reception of Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season (ordinarily Easter Sunday through Pentecost Sunday)
- 4. Observance of the days of fast and abstinence
- 5. Providing for the needs of the Church
