St. Mary's Parish is a vibrant and growing community of faith.

Our parish is happy to welcome all who visit us and share in Christ's life - especially at Sunday Mass. We welcome the

talents and abilities of our parishioners who participate in all our parish groups. We invite you to submit a Registration Form, located at all church entrances and on our website. Once completed, the form can be placed in the collection basket, mailed, or emailed. A minimum of 6 months as a registered parishioner is required when you or members of your family wish to prepare to receive the sacraments (ie: baptism, marriage, etc) at St. Mary's. In order to keep our records up to date, we ask you to notify the parish office when there is a change of address or telephone.
