community. With the



Dear Reverend Monsignor: Dear Reverend Father:

During this year there have been many initiatives to celebrate the Jubilee Year of Hope. Many have visited the Pilgrim Churches in the Diocese, and the Monthly Prayers and Jubilee Newsletters have raised our awareness of the heroes of hope in our midst. Parishes have provided additional spiritual and educational opportunities to nurture the virtue of hope in their communities, and parishioners have become more engaged in ministries which bring hope to those in need.

As we approach the conclusion of this year of the Lord's favour, we are reminded of the prompting of Pope Francis, that debts be forgiven and assistance be given to the poorest among us. Upon the recommendation of the Diocesan Finance Council, several Parish debts to the Diocese were forgiven.

The Episcopal Board recommended that each Parish take up a special "Spirit of Hope Collection" on November 16, 2025, to be used to assist the poor in their respective parishes. Unfortunately, due to a busy Fall schedule, notice of this Diocesan initiative was not communicated to you in a more timely manner. Nevertheless, I ask that you take up a "Spirit of Hope Collection" in your Parish sometime before Christmas and designate the monies received for the support of the poor in your own community.

I look forward to the celebration of the Closing Jubilee Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King on Sunday, December 28, 2025, at 3:00 p.m. It will be a fitting opportunity for us to give thanks to God for the blessings of this Jubilee Year.
