

Voter Fraud Check List

● **Is there legal evidence of voter fraud?**

✓ **YES**

Signed witness affidavits, testimony, analytics, fraudulent ballots discovered in 6 key states PA, GA, MI, WI, NV, AZ

→ Fair and Legitimate Election

● **Is there significant voter fraud that would change the election outcome?**

✓ **YES**

GA: >166,872 fraudulent votes with a margin of difference of 11,779.
PA: >650,000 vs 43,251
AZ: >790,000 vs 10,457
NV: >91,955 vs 33,596
MI: >379,000 vs 154,188
WI: >200,000 vs 20,608

NO

→ Proceed with election results but pursue legal and legislative action to remove voter fraud for the next election.



Illegitimate Election

Voter Fraud Validation (two of the four provide clear validation)

● **Does the “establishment” push to certify the election without supporting investigation into voter fraud allegations?**

11/20: Sen. Mitt Romney (R-Utah) on Thursday directly criticized President Trump for efforts by the president and his allies to reverse the results of the presidential election. (MSM)
12/15: Sen. Mitch McConnell recognizes Joe Biden as the President Elect.

● **Does the Party that benefits from alleged voter fraud push to certify the election without supporting investigation into voter fraud allegations, despite previous positions of voter fraud concerns?**
