



THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER

From the treatise On the Prescription of Heretics by Tertullian, priest

The preaching of the apostles

Our Lord Jesus Christ himself declared what he was, what he had been, how he was carrying out his Father's will, what obligations he demanded of men. This he did during his earthly life, either publicly to the crowds or privately to his disciples. Twelve of these he picked out to be his special companions, appointed to teach the nations.

One of them fell from his place. The remaining eleven were commanded by Christ, as he was leaving the earth to return to the Father after his resurrection, to go and teach the nations and to baptize them into the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

The apostles cast lots and added Matthias to their number, in place of Judas, as the twelfth apostle. The authority for this action is to be found in a prophetic psalm of David. After receiving the power of the Holy Spirit which had been promised to them, so that they could work miracles and proclaim the truth, they first bore witness to their faith in Jesus Christ and established churches throughout Judea. They then went out into the whole world and proclaimed to the nations the same doctrinal faith.

They set up churches in every city. Other churches received from them a living transplant of faith and the seed of doctrine, and through this daily process of transplanting they became churches. They therefore qualify as apostolic churches by being the offspring of churches that are apostolic.

Every family has to be traced back to its origins. That is why we can say that all these great churches constitute that one original Church of the apostles; for it is from them that they all come. They are all primitive, all apostolic, because they are all one. They bear witness to this unity by the peace in which they all live, the brotherhood which is their name, the fellowship to which they are pledged. The principle on which these associations are based is common tradition by which they share the same sacramental bond.

The only way in which we can prove what the apostles taught—that is to say, what Christ revealed to them—is through those same churches. They were founded by the apostles themselves, who first preached to them by what is called the living voice and later by means of letters.

The Lord had said clearly in former times: I have many more things to tell you, but you cannot endure them now. But he went on to say: When the Spirit of truth comes, he will lead you into the whole truth. Thus Christ shows us that the apostles had full knowledge of the truth, for he had promised that they would receive the whole truth through the Spirit of truth. His promise was certainly fulfilled, since the Acts of the Apostles prove that the Holy Spirit came down on them.

PENSAMIENTOS PARA CONSIDERAR

Del tratado de Tertuliano, presbítero, sobre la prescripción de los herejes

LA PREDICACIÓN APOSTÓLICA

Cristo Jesús, nuestro Señor, durante su vida terrena, iba enseñando por sí mismo quién era él, qué había sido desde siempre, cuál era el designio del Padre que él realizaba en el mundo, cuál ha de ser la conducta del hombre para que sea conforme a este mismo designio; y lo enseñaba unas veces abiertamente ante el pueblo, otras aparte a sus discípulos, principalmente a los doce que había elegido para que estuvieran junto a él, y a los que había destinado como maestros de las naciones. Y así, después de la defección de uno de ellos, cuando estaba para volver al Padre, después de su resurrección, mandó a los otros once que fueran por el mundo a adoctrinar a los hombres y bautizarlos en el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo.

Los apóstoles —palabra que significa «enviados»—, después de haber elegido a Matías, echándolo a suertes, para sustituir a Judas y completar así el número de doce (apoyados para esto en la autoridad de una profecía contenida en un salmo de David), y después de haber obtenido la fuerza del Espíritu Santo para hablar y realizar milagros, como lo había prometido el Señor, dieron primero en Judea testimonio de la fe en Jesucristo e instituyeron allí Iglesias, después fueron por el mundo para proclamar a las naciones la misma doctrina y la misma fe. De modo semejante, continuaron fundando Iglesias en cada población, de manera que las demás Iglesias fundadas posteriormente, para ser verdaderas Iglesias, tomaron y siguen tomando de aquellas primeras Iglesias el retoño de su fe y la semilla de su doctrina. Por esto también aquellas Iglesias son consideradas apostólicas, en cuanto que son descendientes de las Iglesias apostólicas. Es norma general que toda cosa debe ser referida a su origen.

Y, por esto, toda la multitud de Iglesias son una con aquella primera Iglesia fundada por los apóstoles, de la que proceden todas las otras. En este sentido son todas primeras y todas apostólicas, en cuanto que todas juntas forman una sola. De esta unidad son prueba la comunión y la paz que reinan entre ellas, así como su mutua fraternidad y hospitalidad. Todo lo cual no tiene otra razón de ser que su unidad en una misma tradición apostólica. El único medio seguro de saber qué es lo que predicaron los apóstoles, es decir, qué es lo que Cristo les reveló, es el recurso a las Iglesias fundadas por los mismos apóstoles, las que ellos adoctrinaron de viva voz y, más tarde, por carta.

El Señor había dicho en cierta ocasión: Muchas cosas me quedan por deciros, pero no podéis cargar con ellas por ahora; pero añadió a continuación: Cuando venga él, el Espíritu de la verdad, os guiará hasta la verdad plena; con estas palabras demostraba que nada habían de ignorar, ya que les prometía que el Espíritu de la verdad les daría el conocimiento de la verdad plena. Y esta promesa la cumplió, ya que sabemos por los Hechos de los apóstoles que el Espíritu Santo bajó efectivamente sobre ellos.



Inspiration for the week

Bankruptcy Update 4/2/21

Well, we're making pretty fair progress in raising the funds needed for our bankruptcy settlement—a very important goal for us if it is to succeed and we're able to move forward and out, as well as give victims some healing for sexual abuses they suffered as children.

If we don't meet certain goals soon, we risk losing the proposed settlement; that very well may lead to lawsuits against individual parishes we've been worried about—maybe hundreds of them since there are just under 400 claims filed. As said before, even the lawyer/legal fees may likely would be much more than what's needed to be contributed by the parish for the bankruptcy settlement.

Most pastors understand the importance of providing funds for the bankruptcy so as to acquire their own parishes' protective channeling injunctions. But some pastors fear the reaction of parishioners at giving such a huge chunk of parish savings, unused and/or unessential property for sale, etc. Our parishioners are very "savvy", so assure your pastors that you understand the situation; that can go a long way in easing their hesitation. The flood is coming, and it is the settlement that is the "dam" that can prevent financial devastation to parishes.

On the flip side, should the bankruptcy fail, nothing is safe from liquidations for legal costs and lawsuit settlements—churches, halls, schools. Nothing. What a tragedy it would be to lose hundreds-of-years old churches and property to legal fees and lawsuit settlements, not to mention much of New Mexico's cultural legacy built over centuries by donations of time, talent and treasure of your families and friends. And, perhaps worse, the loss of access in providing sacramental, spiritual and material nourishment to those in need, as well as teaching our young ones love of God, love of neighbor. One current example: ASF used to provide hundreds of thousands of dollars to charity, but those funds have recently had to go to lawyer and legal fees. The same may happen to individual parishes, which have already been contributing to their own defensive legal fees in this whole process.

We remain very much aware that "the Archdiocese" and "the Parishes" really mean the <u>people</u> of the Archdiocese and parishes having to bear this burden. "The Archdiocese" as not a faceless person responsible for all evil which has occurred in the past, but rather the Church is our family in which members come and go...are born and pass away. We in your Church leadership, lament so very much those who have failed you so grievously in the past. Yet, all we can now do is move forward and look to a new day—hopefully with some healing for victims AND the people of Christ's Church of northern New Mexico.

Frequently-asked questions (FAQs):

Q: Can people contribute individually to the settlement?

A: Yes. Just send a check to, and made out to, the Archdiocese with "for bankruptcy settlement only" in the memo line. We'll keep track and return the money if the deal falls through. You can also go to this contribution link. You can also contribute to your parishes' contribution in the same way, but ensure that your pastor has a setup to do that.

Q: How do we know that all the claims are legitimate.

A: There's no way to ensure ALL are legitimate, but many/most of them—past and present—check out as very likely according to information given in the claims. Once settled, claimants in bankruptcies decide among themselves how to divide it, likely screened by seriousness of the specifics on their claim—what, when, who, etc.

Q: So, why isn't each claim verified?

A: Almost all of the accused offenders are dead and can't be questioned. But given past lawsuits and specifics in the claims, most, if not all, are very credible.

Q: What expenses do the Archdiocese have to pay in the bankruptcy?

A: ASF has to pay not only for our own attorneys along with our normal operating expenses, but also the UCC's attorneys. So...hundreds of hours on both sides, at several hundred dollars per hour for each attorney (they have varying rates)—that goes through \$\$\$ really fast.

Q: Are the Archdiocese's efforts to stop child sexual abuse by clergy working?

A: Very much so. As you can imagine, this has become top priority since this scourge against children has come to light. The last known incident of abuse was over 15 years ago; may God grant we never see another. But vigilance is key—not only for Church leadership, but by everyone.

Other comments heard

C: The Archdiocese is rich! Use YOUR money!!

A: The Archdiocese is anything BUT rich, especially after paying lawsuit settlements for the last 20 years, and bankruptcy legal fees for the last two. ASF declared bankruptcy because of dwindling resources, not because it's "rich". Also, we wouldn't have laid off 20% of our employees in December, sold the Archbishop's much larger former house and have almost all ASF properties on the sale block if we were flush with cash.

C: The Vatican can help!

A: No; a diocese is responsible for its own finances. Anyway, the Vatican can barely pay its own bills these days, especially with COVID reducing contributions.

C: I don't want any of MY money going to a bankruptcy!

A: Okay...but that won't stop possibly crippling lawsuits from endangering your parish anyway.

C: Our parish will just refuse to respond to any lawsuits!


A: Not a good move, to say the least. It would likely result in some default judgement, and parish assets (savings, land, buildings) might be seized by authorities anyway to pay a settlement.






