

THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER

From a commentary on the psalms by Saint Augustine, bishop

In Christ we suffered temptation, and in him we overcame the devil

Hear, O God, my petition, listen to my prayer. Who is speaking? An individual, it seems. See if it is an individual: *I cried to you from the ends of the earth while my heart was in anguish.* Now it is no longer one person; rather, it is one in the sense that Christ is one, and we are all his members. What single individual can cry from the ends of the earth? The one who cries from the ends of the earth is none other than the Son's inheritance. It was said to him: *Ask of me, and I shall give you the nations as your inheritance, and the ends of the earth as your possession.* This possession of Christ, this inheritance of Christ, this body of Christ, this one Church of Christ, this unity that we are, cries from the ends of the earth. What does it cry? What I said before: *Hear, O God, my petition, listen to my prayer; I cried out to you from the ends of the earth.* That is, I made this cry to you from the ends of the earth; that is, on all sides.

Why did I make this cry? *While my heart was in anguish.* The speaker shows that he is present among all the nations of the earth in a condition, not of exalted glory but of severe trial.

Our pilgrimage on earth cannot be exempt from trial. We progress by means of trial. No one knows himself except through trial, or receives a crown except after victory, or strives except against an enemy or temptations.

The one who cries from the ends of the earth is in anguish, but is not left on his own. Christ chose to foreshadow us, who are his body, by means of his body, in which he has died, risen and ascended into heaven, so that the members of his body may hope to follow where their head has gone before.

He made us one with him when he chose to be tempted by Satan. We have heard in the gospel how the Lord Jesus Christ was tempted by the devil in the wilderness. Certainly Christ was tempted by the devil. In Christ you were tempted, for Christ received his flesh from your nature, but by his own power gained life for you; he suffered insults in your nature, but by his own power gained glory for you; therefore, he suffered temptation in your nature, but by his own power gained victory for you.

If in Christ we have been tempted, in him we overcame the devil. Do you think only of Christ's temptations and fail to think of his victory? See yourself as tempted in him, and see yourself as victorious in him. He could have kept the devil from himself; but if he were not tempted he could not teach you how to triumph over temptation.

PENSAMIENTOS PARA CONSIDERAR

De los comentarios de san Agustín, obispo, sobre los salmos

EN CRISTO FUIMOS TENTADOS, EN ÉL VENCIMOS AL DIABLO

Dios mío, escucha mi clamor, atiende a mi súplica. ¿Quién es el que habla? Parece que sea uno solo. Pero veamos si es uno solo: Te invoco desde los confines de la tierra con el corazón abatido. Por lo tanto, se invoca desde los confines de la tierra, no es uno solo; y, sin embargo, es uno solo, porque Cristo es uno solo, y todos nosotros somos sus miembros. ¿Y quién es ese único hombre que clama desde los confines de la tierra? Los que invocan desde los confines de la tierra son los llamados a aquella herencia, a propósito de la cual se dijo al mismo Hijo: Pídemelo: te daré en herencia las naciones, en posesión, los confines de la tierra. De manera que quien clama desde los confines de la tierra es el cuerpo de Cristo, la heredad de Cristo, la única Iglesia de Cristo, esta unidad que formamos todos nosotros.

Y ¿qué es lo que pide? Lo que he dicho antes: Dios mío escucha mi clamor, atiende a mi súplica; te invoco desde los confines de la tierra. O sea: «Esto que pido, lo pido desde los confines de la tierra», es decir, desde todas partes.

Pero, ¿por qué ha invocado así? Porque tenía el corazón abatido. Con ello da a entender que el Señor se halla presente en todos los pueblos y en los hombres del orbe entero no con gran gloria, sino con graves tentaciones.

Pues nuestra vida en medio de esta peregrinación no puede estar sin tentaciones, ya que nuestro progreso se realiza precisamente a través de la tentación, y nadie se conoce a sí mismo si no es tentado, ni puede ser coronado si no ha vencido, ni vencer si no ha combatido, ni combatir si carece de enemigo y de tentaciones.

Éste que invoca desde los confines de la tierra está angustiado, pero no se encuentra abandonado. Porque a nosotros mismos, esto es, a su cuerpo, quiso prefigurarnos también en aquel cuerpo suyo en el que ya murió, resucitó y ascendió al cielo, a fin de que sus miembros no desesperen de llegar adonde su cabeza los precedió.

De forma que nos incluyó en sí mismo cuando quiso verse tentado por Satanás. Nos acaban de leer que Jesucristo, nuestro Señor, se dejó tentar por el diablo. ¡Nada menos que Cristo tentado por el diablo! Pero en Cristo estabas siendo tentado tú, porque Cristo tenía de ti la carne, y de él procedía para ti la salvación; de ti procedía la muerte para él, y de él para ti la vida; de ti para él los ultrajes, y de él para ti los honores; en definitiva, de ti para él la tentación, y de él para ti la victoria.

Si hemos sido tentados en él, también en él vencemos al diablo.

Te fijas en que Cristo fue tentado, y no te fijas en que venció? Reconócete a ti mismo tentado en él, y reconócete también vencedor en él. Podía haber evitado al diablo; pero, si no hubiese sido tentado, no te habría aleccionado para la victoria cuando tú fueras tentado.



AN AFRICAN AMERICAN SERVANT OF GOD ON THE WAY TO SAINTHOOD:

SISTER MARY ELIZABETH LANGE OSP

Elizabeth Clarisse Lange (1784-1882) was born in Cuba after her parents fled revolution in their native Saint Domingue (now Haiti).

In the early 1800's Elizabeth found her way to America and settled in the city of Baltimore, Maryland where other French-speaking refugees from Saint Domingue resided. Elizabeth, a humble and deeply spiritual woman recognized the need for education of the children of other refugees. Despite her status as a refugee herself, she was educated and used her inheritance to offer free education in her home for ten years.

In 1829, Elizabeth and three other women (Roseanne Boegue, Marie Balas and Almaide Duchemin) took their vows and thus the Oblate Sisters of Providence was founded, the first congregation of African American women in the history of the Catholic Church. Elizabeth took the name of Mary and became their first Superior General. Works done by the Sisters were diverse including edu-

cation of youth, founding of orphanages and caring for the elderly and the ill during the cholera outbreak of 1832. The Oblate sisters taught the "colored" children in all of the Catholic schools in Baltimore by 1860. They now have experienced 200 years of service to schools, day care centers, outreach and catechetical programs for all ages. Sister Mary Elizabeth Lange died in Baltimore in 1882 at the age of 98. Mother Mary Elizabeth Lange's cause for sainthood began in 1991. Next, the Pope will consider if Sister Mary will be declared "venerable." After beatification two confirmed miracles will need to be attributed to her before her official canonization can take place.

DECLARACIÓN DEL ARZOBISPO JOHN C. WESTER SOBRE NUESTRO LLAMADO A HABLAR POR LOS QUE NO TIENEN VOZ

ALBUQUERQUE - Jueves, 28 de enero de 2021

Siguiendo el ejemplo de Jesús de amar a Dios y amar a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos, es claro que estamos llamados a ser una voz para los que no tienen voz, a estar del lado de los pobres y vulnerables. Los niños que aún no han nacido no tienen la capacidad de hablar por sí mismos. Dependen de sus madres para sostener sus frágiles vidas antes de su nacimiento, y del cuidado y el amor de los padres y la familia una vez que han nacido. Como personas sensatas y de buena voluntad, sea cual sea nuestro partido político, debemos tomarnos en serio la responsabilidad de hablar en nombre de los no nacidos y proteger sus frágiles vidas.

Reconozco la complejidad que presenta un embarazo no planificado. Sin embargo, la solución a esas complicaciones no es eliminar una vida. El Papa Francisco nos lo recuerda cuando pregunta: "¿Es justo eliminar una vida humana para resolver un problema? La respuesta es: no... Eso es un problema que tiene que ver con la eliminación de una vida humana. Punto" (28/05/19). La solución nunca es acabar con una vida. La solución es acoger la vida y apoyarla y sostenerla, como corresponde porque hemos sido creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios.

A las madres embarazadas que se encuentran en situaciones difíciles, les decimos: estamos con ustedes, y estamos dispuestos a apoyarlas independientemente de los desafíos que enfrenten en su embarazo. Les aseguro que abogamos por todo lo que apoya la vida y el bien común a lo largo de la vida de su hijo: el acceso a una atención médica adecuada y accesible, especialmente la atención prenatal; el acceso a alimentos y vivienda adecuados; el trabajo digno y los salarios justos para ayudar a mantener una familia; el acceso al cuidado de la primera infancia y la inversión necesaria para ello; la financiación adecuada de la educación y el aire y el agua potable para ayudar a mantener la vida para todos. Con estos apoyos sociales esenciales, todos los niños tendrán la oportunidad de crecer en sabiduría, edad y gracia.

A todos los legisladores, les pido abrir sus corazones y mirar de frente a la dignidad humana del niño en desarrollo. Me preocupa profundamente que si no protegemos a los menores y a los vulnerables, ¿quién lo hará? Si no lo hacemos, me temo que nos convertiremos cada vez más en una sociedad de "descarte" contra la que advierte el Papa Francisco. Les pido encarecidamente que dejen de lado la política partidista y escuchen las necesidades de todos nuestros niños. Les pido que trabajen para crear los soportes necesarios para acoger la vida, para superar los retos a los que se pueden enfrentar las mujeres embarazadas, y para proteger los derechos de conciencia de nuestros proveedores de atención médica que no quieren verse obligados a participar en abortos. Trabajemos juntos para encontrar soluciones que ayuden a los más vulnerables a prosperar. - FIN


