Crushed Grapes is the latest piece from the Architectural/Old Iron series. Rust pigmentation from antique architectural iron work and a found tractor wheel creates the basis for this artwork on a pale green hand dyed ground. Dense hand stitching the rusted images, enhances the piece and provides it with visual and dimensional physical texture resulting in interesting shadowing effects in various lighting conditions.

This textile artwork is designed to be displayed on a wall in either a vertical or horizontal orientation. The back of the artwork shows the incorporated hanging system that only needs the accompanying wood slat inserted and it is ready to display.

Exhibition and Publication History

--The **Lincoln Gallery** and **Thompson Valley Art League** selected textile artist Jean M. Judd of Cushing, Wisconsin for inclusion in the **2020 National Fine Art Show**. Artwork selected for inclusion in the exhibit included: *Crushed Grapes*.

This exhibit was open to artwork created since 2017 in the mediums of watercolor, oil, pastel, drawing, acrylics, mixed media, photography, photo artistry, and sculpture. Artwork was selected from the submission pool of 716 artworks from across the country by juror Suzanne Faris, Chairperson of the Department of Art and Art History, Colorado State University.

The exhibition opened September 4, 2020 and was open through October 2, 2020. Cash awards for Best in Show, First Place in six categories, and People's Choice Award were distributed at the opening reception September 11, 2020, from 6:00 – 8:30pm.
