



This is the fourth quilt in an ongoing series exploring the use of bias tape and freeform design. The black leading is handmade bias tape made by the artist and hand appliqued to the Venetian Glass fabric. The piece is hand quilted in 1/8" echo quilting. The piece is hand bound, signed and dated by the artist.
