

Crisis Stabilization Services

Crisis Stabilization provides systematic treatment and support activities designed to provide a short-term alternative to in-patient psychiatric services. This service is intended to stabilize the individual and strengthen the current living situation so that the individual remains in the community during and beyond the crisis period. The specific services include behavior assessment, psychiatric, psychological and functional assessments, stabilization techniques, medication management and monitoring, and intensive care coordination with other agencies and service providers.

Family and Adolescent Services' Crisis
Stabilization program is designed for structured therapeutic treatment and direct interventions that provide temporary, intensive services and supports that prevent emergency, psychiatric hospitalization or institutional placement of individuals who are experiencing serious psychiatric or behavioral problems that jeopardize their current community living situation.

- Identifies and promotes the strength of the individual and family to build family stability and promote improved functioning
- Maintains commitment to quality services and professional ethics in keeping with the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS), state and federal guidelines
- Provides the necessary linkage of support through case management with doctors, schools, courts, hospitals, Family Assessment and Planning Teams (FAPT), and social services
