

How we helped make ends meet...







As we enter the 2020s, we wanted to look back at how far we've come with your support. NICWA has grown so much this decade, and we couldn't have done it without you!

We got a new look!

Our logo changed a lot in 2014. Its updated look represents our past 30 years of service while looking toward the future, and it embodies our values for children and our Native cultures as our greatest strength to help families.





New leadership

In 2015, our founding executive director Terry Cross stepped down, and Sarah Kastelic became his successor as NICWA's executive director. Sarah's passion for the mission and nonstop work ethic have made her a natural leader. Terry has stayed on as NICWA's senior advisor, where you can still find him in the office, at conference, leading trainings, and in tribal communities.

Our membership has exploded!

At the end of 2010, we had about 350 members. We've grown 400%, putting us at 1,400 members today! Our strength is our members, and being able to connect with so many social workers, tribal leaders, and Native child advocates across the continent has been incredible. Thank you to everyone who's joined our program and strengthened our work!





We've helping more families.

Responding to requests for information (RFIs) from families in crisis is a core part of our work. In 2010, we were struggling to fund this program and were unable to respond to many of our callers in a timely way. Now we have multiple



sources of funding to keep this work stable and have successfully responded to 1,200+ RFIs during 2019.

We've trained. A lot.

In the last decade, participants have completed 191,168 hours of training at NICWA events, conferences, and training institutes. 2010 accounted for 15,000 of those hours, while 2019 shot up to nearly 29,000 training hours.

That's an astonishing amount of knowledge, networking, and expertise spread across Indian Country, helping families every day.



Speaking of conference.

We've more than doubled the number of attendees at our annual conference! AC10 had 600 child advocates in attendance, while AC19 had over 1,500! From first-timers to familiar faces, it's always amazing to see everyone gathered together advocating for Native children and families!



We had 20 staff in 2010 compared with 22 staff members today. Despite the same number of people, we're getting so much more done thanks to our increased number of supporters and partners in Indian Country. Thank you to everyone who has made NICWA's substantial growth in services and impact possible. We truly could not do this without you.
