This August, Morgan moved into the dorms at Eastern Illinois University to begin her freshman year as a Journalism major. This was the culmination of a dream realized through Morgan's hard work, the support of her mother, and the services provided by HOW.

Morgan and her mother joined HOW's Supportive Housing Program five years ago following an extended period of time in a local shelter. Despite the upheaval in their lives, Morgan remained committed to staying in school. This required her to commute three hours to and from the shelter, sit in a subway to do her homework, and function on an average of five hours of sleep.

This story is not unusual for the kids HOW serves. Most homeless children experience developmental delays at **four times the rate of other children**. The circumstances of homelessness make it far more difficult for homeless children to attend school and perform well, further hampering their academic success.

Morgan beat the odds with HOW's help! She has been working towards her goal of going to college since she was a little girl. The stable, safe home provided by HOW enabled Morgan to earn scholarships to attend a private high school, participate in an empowerment program geared toward girls, and access assistance in college applications from HOW's youth specialists.

Since Morgan's arrival, HOW has more than **quadrupled the number of children we serve**. This requires that we increase the investment in our youth programming. Exciting new initiatives are

gaining momentum including mentoring and tutoring programs, cooking classes, back to school supply drives, parenting workshops, and job readiness and college prep instruction for teenagers.

"It takes a whole village to get children where they need to be – that is why HOW is crucial" said Morgan's mom Tracy. We are honored to have been a part of Morgan's journey in self-discovery and hope that - with your help - we can do the same for all of the children in our program.


