 **The Daily Journey: Writing Project**

In chapter 17, we have a quote that reads, “Victory is found not just at the end of the road. It is in every humble step we take every day to reach the end of the road.” Explain what this means. What does it mean to you personally?

 **Saints Who Have Gone Before: Biography Project**

The hymn in chapter 17, “Onward, Christian Soldiers,” contains a line that reads, “Like a mighty army moves the church of God; Brothers [meaning brothers and sisters], we are treading where the saints have trod.” Similarly, the writer of the book of Hebrews in the Bible (we don’t know who wrote that book) says that there is a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us, including those of great faith from the past, like Abraham, Moses, and Rahab. Truly, we are standing on the shoulders of great Christian believers that went before us, a few of which are mentioned in the chapter. Pick a person from history or from your life and write a biography of that person, telling of how that person has inspired you in your faith in Jesus.

 **The Great Commission: Scripture Project**

The words we read in chapter 17 from Matthew 28:19–20, “Go and make followers of all people in the world... Teach them to obey everything that I have told you to do,” are part of what is called Jesus’s Great Commission. It is an instruction to Jesus’s followers to go into the world and teach people about Him. Select a Scripture that you can hold on to as you go about the Great Commission.
