

2023 President's Challenge

Your challenge if you chose to participate is to make a quilt, the size of your choice, but no smaller than a wall hanging – 18" x 24", *using your* **three** *initials*. [Initials utilized are your choice, as some of us have more than three.]

One initial should represent the main color
Another initial should represent the pattern or block
The third initial should represent the quilting motif
Any initial can be *any* of the above items.

Creative license allowed with colors and quilting motifs (ie blue can be aqua, stipple can be meander, etc.)
