Traditional covered dish meal

Final Pizza Box Block Conclusion: She will prepare a label for each box so that the applicable quilters can sign the label on each appropriate box. The original monthly form will remain on top of box as a reference, but the new label is a keepsake for box owner. No permanent pen markers involved.

Traditional annual heart exchange: Totally a voluntary project. A simple pattern will be provided. The hearts can be smaller but not larger than pattern as some used as Christmas ornaments. They have been quilted, made with wool applique, woven or pieced fabric and fabric cut into silhouettes. They will be put into brown paper bags and participants draw a number to determine the selection order.

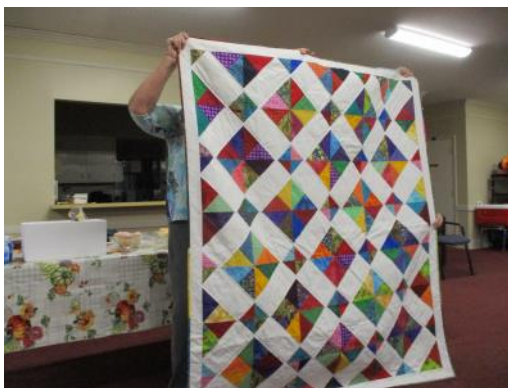
MEETING ADJOURNED: Cindy Pannier thanked all the 5" block participants for contributing to our program.

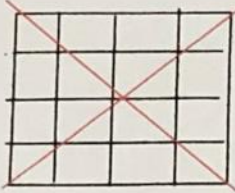


Sweet Sixteen Block Instructions

Sweet Sixteen Instructions



You need 5" squares. 150 –300 sqs. Depending on the size of quilt you want. Fabric for sashing and borders. You will need a yard stick to cut your blocks.

1. Layout 4x4 square, stitching them together to form a 16" block using the chain piecing method being careful to nest your seams. [Lap quilt size is 6 block](#)
2. Lay your sew finished block on your cutting mat then cut them diagonally from corner to corner without moving the block. -red line

3. You will then have 4 pieces from each block. Use 2 of these triangles to form a square. Square up your blocks trimming to 12.5 in.

4. **BIAS EDGES:** Remember that the edge of the block will be on the bias. Don't worry about it. Bias edges can be your friend or your enemy. Don't stretch or fight with it. If you are concerned about bias edges on the outside edge of your block use a long stitch around the edge of your block to keep its shape.

Sashing-Cut the desired width of sashing. Chain piece your sashing to the right side of your block, using ~~only the~~ first 2 blocks in each row leaving the block on the right side without a sashing. Then join the 1st row block 1 to block 2 to block 3. Repeat for the remainder of the quilt. When you are placing sashing between rows, be careful to line up your horizontal and vertical sashing.



Note to Self:

**Do not sit on the floor
without a plan on how to
get back up.**
