Have any of you looked at the color scheme and defined it using the color wheel? We've been learning about color all year, has the way you use color in your home agreed with the principles of the color wheel?



REPEAT QUILTER'S TIP

For 5" blocks or the Pizza Box block, be sure to cut off selvage from material.

NOVEMBER MEETING--PIZZA BLOCK EXCHANGE CONCLUSION: Cindy Pannier

Plan to make time to sign your blocks using Marilyn's verified pen, Pentel Gel roller pen for fabric. It doesn't wash out. This step will let the box owner connect the blocks with the makers.

AUGUST PROGRAM: Quilt As You Go---Quilt of Valor Project by Polly Duggan & Friends (Hands-On)

Polly Duggan introduced our program by reminded group that we made a Sharon Pederson *Reversible Quilt* for our adopted Katrina Quilter using string blocks in 2007. Polly updated Ann Fox's instructions to assemble tonight's quilt.

At our July meeting, kits were distributed to take home and assemble. And as instructed, the delivered string pieced blocks are ready for assembly.

For this "hands on" project, Polly organized stations to size, verify, machine stitch blocks together with sashing, and hand stitch one side of the sashing. We had quality controllers in place to check on progress. Polly had prepared detailed instructions and a finished block diagram. By the evening's conclusion, Polly had enough blocks for a QOV quilt. Credit is due to Polly and her team of station leaders who made the assembly line project possible.
