These can be out of date, style fabric, or simply fabrics you no longer love, or what are not you new ugly fabrics.

1. Pick out three (3) Light fabrics

three (3) Medium Fabrics

three (3) Dark Fabrics

- 2. Cut one-half (1/2) yard from each of the nine (9) fabrics.
- 3. From each half (1/2) yard of fabric you will cut:

Two (2)--four and one-half inch strips==(4 1/2")

Three (3)--two and one-half inch strips==(2 1/2")

Yes, you will have a scrap left over.
