She opened her presentation by focusing on her beautiful blue and white sampler quilt with 25 traditional blocks. This wonderful visual was used to introduce her 2022 challenge.

Pizza Box Swap Quilt Challenge Voluntary block exchange for 2022 Pizza boxes used as container for participants' fabrics: 2 yards of focus fabric

2 yards of background fabric

Approximately 2 yards of auxiliary fabrics. 4-8 different fabrics to coordinate with focus fabric. Fat quarters or fat eights are fine.

Any block pattern can be used but must finish as a 12 X 12" block.

Begin with your chosen block to be finished and turned in at our January Meeting. Form enclosed in box with your block and fabrics will be Outline listing:

Owner's name

January: owner's name and block's name

Lines provided for each month for quilter's name and block name.

Each month the pizza boxes are randomly exchanged, with new blocks assembled using owner's fabric only.

In November, you should have twelve 12 ½ X 12 ½ unfinished blocks to be assembled by the owner

Don't make it hard as you are committing to make one block each month using the owner's fabrics.

Cindy brought some reference books. Many sources for free blocks include: "Quilters Cache" website; the National Quilt Museum in Paducah issues blocks.





NOTE: On November 17th, Lucy Large emailed participating members an outline of tips to help as you select fabrics and make your first block for this challenge.




She made a sweet custom quilt for her neighbor's granddaughter. The child's mother requested an "Unicorn" theme. There is no batting as she used flannel.
