

File A Claim

All parents are able to file a claim on behalf of themselves and their child/ren against the bonding insurance agency of the school. The Ohio laws referenced in this evening's warning were as follows: Ohio Revised Code 3.07, Section 2901.01 and Section 2919.22. You should include this information in your claim by referencing Ohio laws that were violated as mentioned in the November 15, 2021 board meeting. More laws and codes can be referenced and sought here: <https://codes.ohio.gov> Use the Ohio Revised Codes "Keyword Search" bar to search terms such as, "Child Abuse," "Sexual Abuse," "Reporting Child Abuse" "Child Neglect" etc.

You need to create a document to serve as your CLAIM with the above information, and also include an outlined list of events that have occurred since Covid-19 hit, and how the school has responded. You should also include how both you and your child/children were affected. Do so in chronological order.

A couple examples would be the Superintendent's notification during the summer that masks would not be required for students for the 2021-22 school year, in the Middle and High schools, only to have Board Member Patrick Meade motion at the last minute, two days before school started in August, to mandate masks K-12. Furthermore, this was despite the fact that twice the number of parents, 538 of them signed a petition to have the choice whether or not to send their children to school wearing a mask. That number amounted to twice as many as those who were in favor of a mandate. You may also use the lag in reopening the school for face-to-face learning, and how that affected your family, when other schools in the area were reopening. Another example would be the low number of cases in the school district compared to the entire Butler County area, which was often used as a reasoning excuse by the school.

Any illness or injury to your child should be included. Example: Masks should be changed every 3 hours.

Lastly, you should include your complete name, address and preferred contact method.

Once you have completed your OUTLINE of contributing factors for filing a CLAIM, mail A COPY to BOTH the school and the insurance company via CERTIFIED MAIL with a RETURN RECEIPT to the following addresses. They will have to sign for it and you'll receive a postcard with the information that it was received.

Formal complaints can and should also be made against any and all members of a school district who hold a state license. This includes, all councilors, teachers, and all administrators, including the superintendent. Anyone who has forced the mask wearing on students or disciplined students for the mask wearing, can be investigated by the State of Ohio for child abuse and child neglect, among other state and federal laws. Sanctions can and should be placed on their Ohio Department of Education license.
