# Children in Need of Services

History of legislative development
Enacted in 2013, Effective in January 2014
Originally envisioned to focus on services
Enacted to resemble former law on unruly children

Present barriers to effectiveness
No responsible agency
Significant variation among courts statewide
No consensus on how CHINS programs should operate
Little financial support, state or local

#### • Vision for future

Fill statewide coordinator position
Go back to focus on services
Consider need for change to legislation and/or court rules to support new focus
Strive for uniformity on process if not details
