SOCIAL SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Teen Leadership Academy Program focuses on communication, project creation and development, and career exploration through in-depth training, motivational speakers, and mentorship. Members, Harlee Heim, Carissa Scheel, Mercedes Jones, Kerstynn Heim, Ella Fagerhaug, Teagan Scheel, and Tucker Thompson added several fun and exciting activities to this year's Achievement Day line-up. First included a 4-H Color Run and 3 on 3 Basketball tournament in the Wessington Springs Park. Fifty youth engaged in these activities. Youth organizers found a major sponsor, created a course, and advertised their event. Youth from 5 other communities were welcomed to the event. Entry fees equaled cans of food for the local food pantry. A substantial donation of canned goods was welcomed by food pantry coordinator. TLA members also organized 4-H Youth Ag Olympics. This entertainment was viewed after supper on the last night of Achievement Days. Two TLA youth hosted an "All About Pigs" workshop where youth learned about judging, nutrition, ear notching and identifying swine breeds. Youth enjoyed a pork loin supper too!

LIFE SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Jerauld-Buffalo Shooting Sports continues to grow. The archery program grew in its third year along with other disciplines BB gun, Air Pistol and Air Rifle. Weekly practice dates stayed on Sunday afternoons for 2022, allowing for more youth to participate and avoid other sports conflicts. The shooting sports season runs from January to April. Gun safety at the youth level ensures lasting legacies of South Dakota youth enjoying the outdoors. 28 youth participated within the shooting sports program.

7 members attended the **State 4-H Livestock & Skillathon** competition in Brookings in September. Highlights included Swayzee Dunsmore as overall high beginner and Teagan Scheel as the overall high junior. Youth also represented very well in the livestock Skillathon contest. In January, Abby Kolousek will be representing SD 4-H at the National Hippology Contest in Denver along with Hannah Heezen, Caroline Witte, and Raylee Fagerhaug on the National Horse Judging Team and Carissa Scheel and Harlee Heim on the national Livestock Quiz Bowl team. We are extremely proud of our 4-H youth and the hard work they have put into these competitions!

A new Premier Exhibitor contest was added this year for SD 4-H. Points included showmanship, animals placings and livestock skillathon knowledge. Champion Beginner was Swayzee Dunsmore and Reserve Champion Senior was Carissa Scheel.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

4-Hers were able to participate in youth in action opportunities. Our annual **Top Chef Competition** took place this past summer. Each



youth drew ahead of time for their secret ingredient. On the day of the competition, they prepared recipes for the Burger Battle. Each youth used ground beef provided by a Land O Lakes grant. Youth also participated in fashion review and public presentations at the county and state level.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Jerauld-Buffalo 4-H Celebrates

100 years in 4-H. Early records date back to 1922 in the county.



It was fun to dig back in the archives to discover all our rich 4-H history and sharing the 4-H story with our community. 4-H is about creating leaders and a leadership highlight includes Harlee Heim's **Vet Science Camp**. Prairie View Veterinary Clinic provided the host site for the two morning sessions for the ages 14 and up, and each session had 8 youth in them. During camp, youth were able to observe a feline spay. During the lab portion of day camp youth were able to dissect a bovine eye, administer vaccines correctly, and suture bananas. Expanding learning opportunities for all ages is important so for the afternoon session twenty-three youth, ages 13-8 joined the fun. These youth learned how to do physical exams, administer vaccine, how to conduct pet first aid, make a total mixed ration, and make dog treats to take home to their pets! "I hope we helped inspire a new group of animal care takers, producers, and veterinarians!" stated Heim. Heim received Reserve Champion in the 4-H Mastery Showcase for her work on this project.
