- Training Development

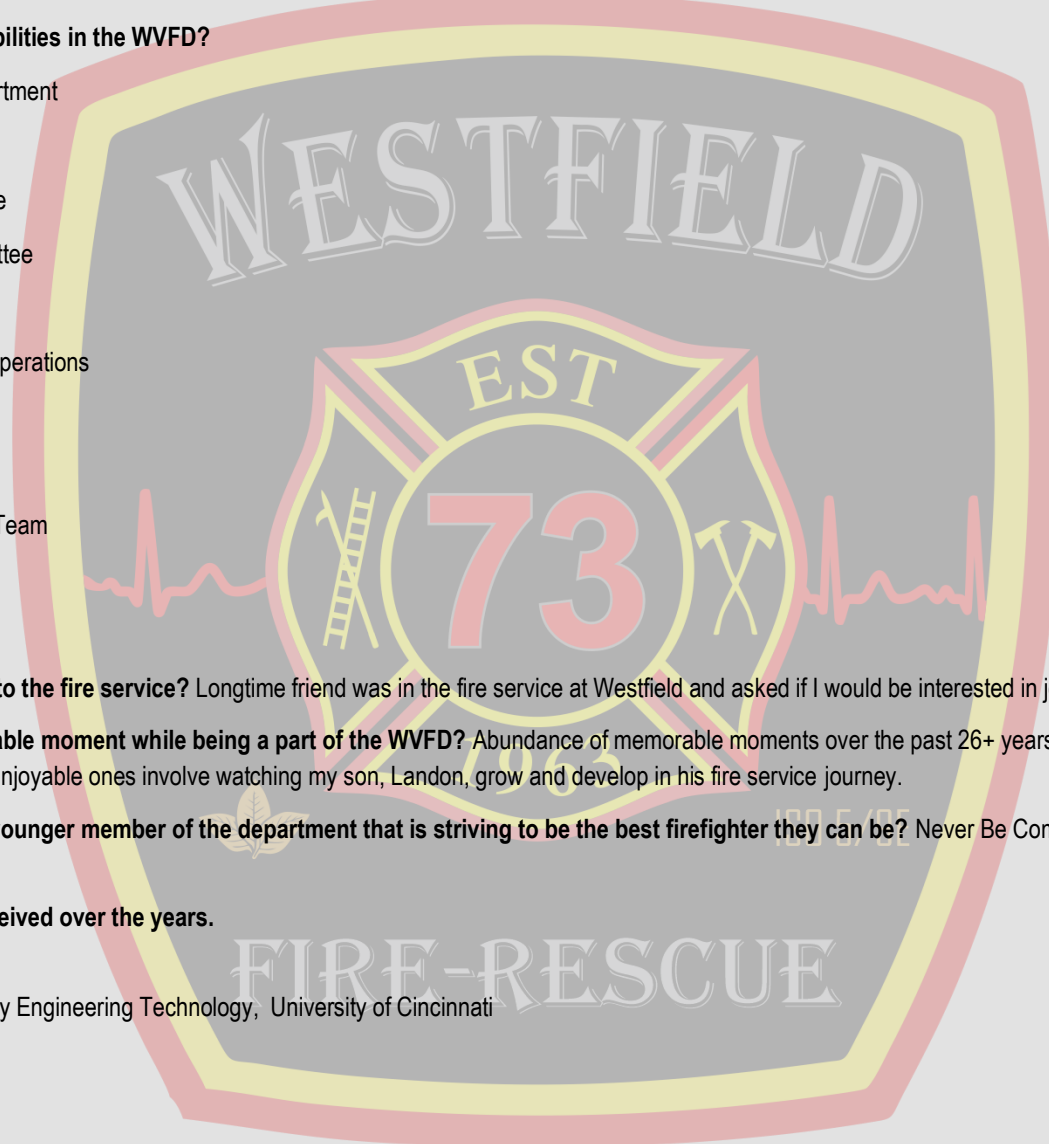
3. What were the reasons you got into the fire service? Longtime friend was in the fire service at Westfield and asked if I would be interested in joining.
