
SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS

LIVING COSTS

One of Australia's (and the world's) most affordable cities, Adelaide's ease of access, safety, and friendly community spirit make it a great learning environment. While the cost of living increases annually in most cities, Adelaide's average living costs (between \$350 and \$700), make it 16% cheaper than Sydney and 13% less than Melbourne (IDP 2024). This means students studying in Adelaide will have more money to spend on food, accommodation, supplies, travel, and entertainment.

International students are advised to consider the travel, tuition and living expenses highlighted by the Australian Department of Immigration and Citizenship before making a choice of place to live and study. The Department's expenses estimates reflect the annual financial requirements which determine a student's eligibility for study in Australia.


GETTING AROUND AND TRANSPORTATION

Adelaide is planned on a 'city square' grid, so places are easy to find. It's also surrounded by a broad band of civic parklands, so there's always green, open areas easily within reach. Traversed by walking and bike tracks, the city features parklands, often including playing fields, tree-lined open green space, gardens, ponds, wetlands, tennis or basketball courts, and other features.

Adelaide city is also quite flat, so walking or cycling are a logical option, with many dedicated bike lanes and paths in the city and suburbs. There's also electric scooter hire. Public transport includes buses, trains, and free inner-city trams. International students are eligible for a travel concession Metrocard.

FOOD AND DRINK CULTURE

Adelaide's food and drink scene is one of the best in Australia. Head to the busy cafes. clubs, bars, and restaurants along Peel and Leigh Streets; or grab local favourites including pho (noodle soup) or bánh mì at any number of Vietnamese eateries. Chinese, Japanese, Thai, Indian, European, and global styes are also well represented –and all close to GHE's campus in Rundle Mall. Then there's numerous busy pubs, clubs, bars, and live music venues for additional entertainment. For food and drink shopping you can't go past Adelaide's iconic Central Market, just a short tram ride away from GHE.

Course Summary

The overall aim of the MIT(SM) is to provide students with a bridge between IT/IS and management. Basing the course of study on the fundamentals of information security strategy, networks, risk management, governance and ethics, a security management perspective will integrate the knowledge, skills, and techniques required to manage security challenges in organisations.

Furthermore, the soft skills required of managers will be integrated throughout as they are closely aligned to GHE's graduate attributes encompassing knowledge-based professionalism, skilled communication, problem solving, critical and creative thinking, social responsibility. The course learning outcomes (CLOs) mirror this positioning. Students are required to attain 180 credit points before enrolling in Capstone units under Year 2 Semester 2.

- Applicants must attach certified copies of transcripts of all relevant previous studies including proof of completion; photo page from passport or other birth records.
- Evidence of English Language proficiency and any other documentation requested in the form.
- Applicants seeking special consideration in relation to any prior educational disadvantage, or reasonable adjustments in relation to a disability please read the Student Disability Policy and the associated Procedure provided additional information located at https://globalhe.edu.au/policy.
- Applicants seeking credit for prior studies must apply for credit transfer and will be assessed in accordance with the Credit and Recognition of Prior Learning Policy. and associated Procedure Scanned documents will be accepted but applicants should be prepared to provide original documents and program/course outlines and original certified copies of required documents upon request at any time.
- Where qualifications have been completed, using another name, evidence must be provided of the change of name. If documents are in a language other than English, an officially certified English translation of each document must be provided together with certified copies of the original documents.
- An applicant for admission who is under exclusion based on academic performance or misconduct from any higher education provider, whether in Australia or elsewhere, is required to include all details of the exclusion in their application for admission.
- Applicants for readmission will be assessed under the current rules applicable to the same course. If the course has been discontinued or is currently not offered the applicant will be offered admission to a comparable course, provided that they meet the admission requirements and that a place is available in that course.

2 CHECK ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Some students may require more time to ensure they receive their visa.
