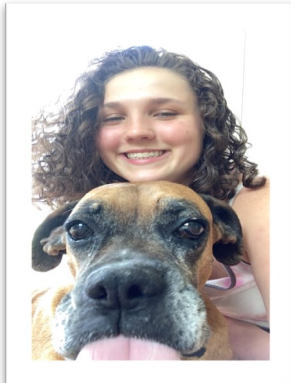
Send Off Night
