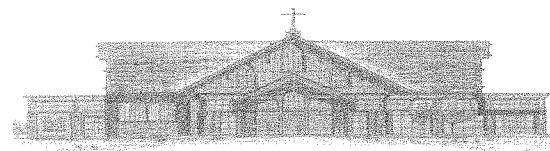

BAKER DIOCESE FOURTH ANNUAL CATHEDRAL CONSERVATION

COLLECTION: St. Francis de Sales Cathedral, located in Baker City is the "Church of the Diocese." Construction took three years from 1905-08. It is only in a Cathedral where one can find the "cathedra," the chair of the bishop.

St. Francis de Sales Cathedral belongs to every Catholic in the Diocese. For years, the small Cathedral parish has borne the burden of maintaining this large and historic building. Three years ago, the Presbyteral Council of the diocese, in consultation with Bishop Cary, decided to bring relief to the Cathedral parish by conducting an annual Cathedral Conservation Collection.

Since its inception, this collection has assisted the cathedral in two major projects. Last year, through your generosity, this collection allowed the parish to replace the entire boiler and heating controls. The broken and missing granite blocks have been replaced and repointed. Most recently, through your generosity, all of the wood on the exterior has been repaired and repainted. This grand old Cathedral is beginning to shine again, thanks to you.

Please take a yellow donation envelope from the pew, the back of the church or the office. Please prayerfully consider a donation to this necessary collection. Your checks should be made payable to St. Thomas Catholic Church and bring them to Mass on the weekend of January 22-23. You may also drop them by the office, or mail them to us. We will then write one check to the Diocese for the amount collected.

You have proven your generosity time after time. The 2021 Cathedral Conservation Collection brought in \$94,785 along with \$75,000 from a generous donor, totalling \$169,785. Many much needed projects were funded (\$98,684): basement drains, security locks, external basement doors, lighting ballasts, and external paint. The projected work will be replacement of the front stairs of the cathedral. If you look at any photo of the cathedral you will immediately see that this is going to be a major project. Let us continue our commitment to our beloved cathedral and to keep it in the best condition we can for future generations of Catholics. God bless you, and I thank you for your generosity.

The Imitation of Christ by Thomas Kempis

The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis is a Christian devotional book. It was first composed in Latin ca.1418-1427. It is a handbook for spiritual life arising from the Devotio Moderna movement, of which Kempis was a member. The Imitation is perhaps the most widely read devotional work next to the Bible, and is regarded as a devotional and religious classic. Its popularity was immediate, and it was printed 745 times before 1650. Apart from the Bible, no book has been translated into more languages than the Imitation of Christ. The text is divided into four books, which provide detailed spiritual instructions: "Helpful Counsels of the Spiritual Life", "Directives for the Interior Life", "On Interior Consolation" and "On the Blessed Sacrament". The approach taken in the Imitation is characterized by its emphasis on the interior life and withdrawal from the world, as opposed to an active imitation of Christ by other friars. The book places a high level of emphasis on the devotion to the Eucharist as key element of spiritual life.
