

- They become the hands and feet of Jesus to bring his Good News to the mission field of their neighborhood and parish."



Dear Parishioners,

On the weekend of January 21-22, the Diocese will be conducting the fifth annual Cathedral Conservation Collection. St. Francis de Sales Cathedral, located in Baker City is the "Church of the Diocese." Construction took three years from 1905-08. It is only in a Cathedral where one can find the "cathedra," the Chair of the Bishop.

St. Francis de Sales Cathedral belongs to every Catholic in the Diocese. For years, the small Cathedral parish has borne the burden of maintaining this large and historic building. Three years ago, the Presbyteral Council of the Diocese, in consultation with Bishop Cary, decided to bring relief to the Cathedral parish by conducting an annual Cathedral Conservation Collection.

Since its inception in 2019, this collection has assisted the Cathedral in these projects:

- full bathroom replacement
- new boiler and heating controls
- replacement of broken and missing granite blocks
- repair and repainting of exterior trim and doors

What a difference these repairs made! This grand old Cathedral is beginning to shine again, thanks to you.

The next major project for the cathedral will be the replacement of the front steps of the cathedral and the sidewalks. If you look at any photo of the cathedral you in the diocesan Chronicle can see that this is going to be a structural challenge. Fr. Suresh Telegani, Cathedral Rector, has already consulted an architect. It was quickly determined that structural engineers need to be involved in the process as the front of the cathedral is supported by the steps needing to be replaced. Although actual construction estimates have not yet been finalized, initial projections for the cost could be in excess of \$1,000,000. Your help is still needed.

There are yellow envelopes available in the pews. I ask that you prayerfully consider a donation to this necessary collection. Please make your checks payable to St. Thomas Catholic Church, and bring them to Mass on the weekend of January 27-28. You may also drop them by the office, or mail them to us. We will then write one check to the Diocese for the amount collected.

You have proven your generosity time after time, and I thank you. Let us continue our commitment to our beloved Cathedral by keeping it in the best condition we can for future generations of Catholics. God Bless you, and I thank you for your generosity.



Its staff members are appointed by Bishop Cary and have received special training to represent him and the Church in judicial proceedings for marriage cases and matters of Canon law. Most of its work involves assisting divorced people who are interested in proving the nullity of a prior marriage bond, allowing them to remarry in the Church. 

January 2 – St. Gregory Nazianzen (389). Known as "The Theologian" for his faithfulness and eloquence, St. Gregory was unwillingly made Bishop of Sasima. He worked to clarify the Church's teachings about the Holy Trinity.

January 16 – St. Berard and Companions (1220). St. Francis of Assisi sent St. Berard and his companions to evangelize in the Muslim territories. After being arrested in Morocco, they were martyred after refusing to stop preaching and renounce their Faith.

January 23 - St. Marianne Cope

(1918). St. Marianne began religious life as an educator in New York schools, and later became a nurse. In 1883, she helped St. Damien de Veuster serve the leper colonies of Hawaii, continuing his work after his death.

January 25 – Conversion of St. Paul (1st Century). Formally called "Saul", he persecuted the Christians until Jesus appeared to him on the road to Damascus, saying, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9:5). After that, Saul became Paul and traveled around the known world, preaching the Faith.

What qualities can I pursue to make me a better follower of Jesus?

Actually, when you were baptized, made your First Communion, or got Confirmed, the Holy Spirit conferred gifts to help you grow in strength and holiness. Recognizing these gifts and



nurturing them will certainly make you a better Christian.

Wisdom: This gift helps us stay focused on God's will and His plan for us.

Understanding: Lets us grasp truths. It means seeing with the heart and the mind.

Counsel: Also called "right judgment," counsel enables us to weigh alternatives to make the right choice.

Fortitude: The ability to remain firm against pressure. (Also called courage.)

Knowledge: A person with knowledge sees more than one dimension of an issue to determine the right path.

Piety: Helps us think of ourselves as children of God and be eager to serve

Fear of the Lord: The wonder and awe God inspires encourages us to respect Him and all his creations.

The more you use these gifts, the more you will grow in faith and holiness. Then you will certainly become a better Christian.




