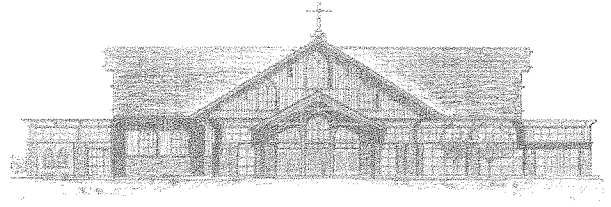

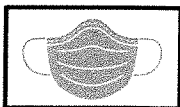

MASKS/FACE SHIELDS: COVID viral spread is affected by: (1) distance from someone not wearing a face covering. (2) Sneezing and coughing which increases the number of virus particles near you. (3) Singing or speaking forcefully which releases more virus than speaking quietly. **Mass attendees at St. Thomas can respect others by socially distancing (6 feet in all directions) and properly wearing face masks or face shields in the manner recommended by the CDC: that is, covering the nose and mouth.**



ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17. MASSES AND DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES: Mass at 8am and 12:10 pm; Liturgy of the Word and Ashes at 5:00pm; 5:45pm; 6:30pm and 7:15pm



LENTEN OBLIGATIONS: Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday (February 17th) and Good Friday (April 2nd). In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

The U.S. bishops define fasting as eating one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted as necessary to maintain strength.



STATIONS OF THE CROSS begin Friday, February 19, at 6:00 pm in the English language, and 7:00 pm in the Spanish language.
