

Religious Exemption from Covid-19 Vaccination

To Whom it may concern,

I am writing on behalf of _____, a member of our congregation of God a Minute Church, in regarding their religious conviction against forced vaccines. Based on the understanding the rights to be treated equally based on creed, to freely hold and practice creed beliefs of one's choosing, are fundamental human rights for protection by Humans Right Code and the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms. We choose to exercise our rights to demand a religious exemption from the requirements to be vaccinated using the Covid-19 shots. We must follow the Word of God and we also exhort others to a conscientious objection to these vaccines. Yet, our deep love and care for others makes us more determined to exercise whatever alternatives possible to ensure other's safety in each individual case.
