I attended the Salon du Chocolat, 2023 in Paris at the end of October. I joined hundreds of chocolate makers from dozens of cocoa-growing countries, showing off our wares. At last year's salon, I had spent a week in the Ivoirian booth, selling chocolates made with SOCOPLAN cooperative chocolate, our first Ivoirian chocolate partner.

This year, I was at the CocoaTown booth (they manufacture, distribute the chocolate machinery PH&F provides to the villages). I talked to thousands of salon attendees about our **Chocolat des Villages** project. Our goal is to increase to 12 chocolate mini-factories in cocoa-growing villages throughout Côte d'Ivoire. The **Chocolat des Villages** brand will be sold in Africa. Europe. and the U.S.
