One Party, not listed in decision FCTC/MOP3(2), submitted credentials in accordance with Rule 18 of the Rules of Procedure and those credentials were found to be in conformity. The draft decision was approved, as proposed and the agenda item was closed.

Second meeting of Committee A In the chair: Dr Alan Gerard Ludowyke (Sri Lanka) Item 5 (cont) Protocol instruments and technical matters Item 5.2 Road map, timelines and steps to conduct evidence-based research (Articles 6.2 and 13.2) The Chair opened the agenda item and gave the floor to Mr Theodore Leggett, Research Officer at the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) to refer to the collaboration between the Convention Secretariat and the UNODC. The Committee was invited to consider the report contained in document FCTC/MOP/3/6 and approve the draft decision contained in Annex 2 of the report. Comments were invited from the floor. The Convention Secretariat responded to the issues raised. One Party introduced a series of amendments. The Chair requested that the draft decision text be shown, allowing the Committee to review the proposed amendments. The Convention Secretariat presented the Chair's text, which included the suggested amendments to the draft decision and invited comments from the floor. The Committee was not able to reach consensus on the proposed amendments in the meeting. Some delegations requested more time for their regional consultations and requested the document containing the proposed amendments be made available in other languages. The agenda item was suspended and the meeting adjourned. The Committee was also invited to approve the draft decision published by the Convention Secretariat as a white paper. At the invitation of the Chair, the Convention Secretariat provided introductory remarks. The Chair invited comments from the floor. Discussion of the agenda item was suspended. Item 7.3 Payment of Assessed Contributions and measures to reduce Parties in arrears The agenda item was opened and the Chair invited the Committee to note the report contained in document FCTC/MOP/3/10 Rev.1. The Committee was also invited to approve the draft decision annexed to the document. At the invitation of the Chair, the Convention Secretariat provided some introductory remarks and informed the Committee that the following Parties were no longer in arrears: Benin, Brazil, Gambia, Hungary, Saudi Arabia and Togo. Comments were invited from the floor and the Convention Secretariat responded to the issues raised. The Chair gave the floor to the Convention Secretariat who read out the various proposed amendments to the amended draft decision. The report was noted and the draft decision was approved, as amended. The agenda item was closed. Item 7.4 Investment Fund for implementation of the Protocol to Eliminate Illicit Trade in Tobacco Products The agenda item was opened and the Chair invited the Committee to note the report contained in Annex 1 of document FCTC/MOP/3/11. The Committee was also invited to approve the draft decision contained in Annex 2 of the document. At the invitation of the Chair, the Convention Secretariat provided some introductory remarks, and comments were invited from the floor. The Convention Secretariat responded to the issues raised. The report was noted and the decision was approved, as proposed. The agenda item was closed.

Item 7.5 Review of accreditation of nongovernmental organizations with the status of observer to the Meeting of the Parties

The agenda item was opened and the Chair invited the Committee to note the report contained in document FCTC/MOP/3/12 and approve the draft decision in the Annex of the report. The Chair invited comments from the floor. At the invitation of the Chair, the Convention Secretariat responded to the issues raised.

The meeting was adjourned.

Item 6 Reporting, implementation assistance and international cooperation

Item 6.1 Reporting and information sharing under the Protocol (including improving the reporting system of the Protocol)

The Committee was invited to consider the revised reporting instrument for the Protocol as contained in Annex 2, and the draft decision contained in Annex 3 of document FCTC/MOP/3/7. The Chair gave the floor to the Head of the Convention Secretariat to provide some introductory remarks. The floor was opened for discussion. The Convention Secretariat responded to the issues raised.

The Chair invited a Party to read out the proposed amendments to the draft decision contained in Annex 3 of document FCTC/MOP/3/7. In the absence of a consensus, it was suggested that the item remain open for consideration pending the outcome of informal discussions.

– (cont) The Panama Declaration

Comments were invited from the floor on the draft text of the Panama Declaration. Parties put forward and discussed amendments to the text. Most amendments were agreed upon except one. The Head of the Convention Secretariat provided an explanation concerning having in-house technical expertise versus coordinating technical assistance provided through different actors. In the absence of a consensus on one proposal, the Chair announced that the agenda item would be discussed at the next Plenary meeting.

The Chair resumed the session and reopened the agenda item contained in document FCTC/MOP/3/12. The Chair projected the draft decision with amendments proposed by a Party seeking the Committee's approval. At the invitation of the Chair, the Convention Secretariat replied to the issues raised. The Committee noted the report and the decision was adopted, as amended. The agenda item was closed.

Item 7.7 Appointment of the Head of the Convention Secretariat: report by the Bureau

The Chair opened the agenda item and invited the Committee to note the report contained in document FCTC/MOP/3/14. The Committee was also invited to approve the draft decision published by the Convention Secretariat as a white paper with an updated text of the draft decision contained in the annex of document FCTC/MOP/3/14, as proposed by the Bureau. At the invitation of the Chair, a member of the Bureau introduced the item. Comments were invited from the floor. One Party requested that their proposal to adjust the provisional criteria contained in the annex of the proposed draft decision be reported in the official record for consideration of the next Bureaus of the MOP and of the Conference of the Parties. The Convention Secretariat replied to the issues raised, confirming that the criteria listed in the annex of the proposed draft decision and the decision was approved. The agenda item was closed.

Item 7.6 Possible amendments to the Rules of Procedure of the Meeting of the Parties

The agenda item was opened and the Chair invited the Committee to note the report contained in document FCTC/MOP/3/13. The Committee was also invited to approve the draft decision published on the restricted access website as a white paper with an updated text of the draft decision contained in the annex of document FCTC/MOP/3/13. The Convention Secretariat provided introductory remarks. At the invitation of the Chair, a Party read out proposed amendments to the draft decision and the floor was opened for comments. The Convention Secretariat replied to the issues raised. Consideration of the agenda item was suspended and the meeting was adjourned.

Delegations are encouraged to opt for group or regional statements, in lieu of individual statements.

Interpretation and statements

Interpretation will be provided in the six official languages of the United Nations (Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish). Delegates are requested to send a copy of their statement to interpret@who.int at least 30 minutes in advance. This does not prevent delegates from making changes upon delivery, but it will facilitate clarity and accuracy in all languages. When submitting a statement by email please specify, both in the subject line of the email and at the top of the attached statement, the name of the country/group, the meeting (for example, Plenary, Committee A or Committee B) and the number of the relevant agenda item. Delegates are requested to deliver statements at a normal speaking pace. Rapid delivery risks impeding clarity and accuracy in interpretation. Statements provided in advance are treated as confidential and checked against delivery for the purpose of the official record.
