H. Michael Sanders, Electronic Media Communications, UC Blue Ash

... is a photographer, poet, & media artist. He has exhibited & published internationally, receiving numerous national & international awards for his creative work. He is currently a professor & founding department chair of Electronic Media Communications at UC Blue Ash, where he has been on the faculty for over 35 years. He is also co-founder of the UC Blue Ash Art Gallery and serves as a curator of exhibitions, as well as an editor of gallery publications.

Allie Blankenship, Cincinnati Art Museum

... is a curatorial assistant in photography. She has held positions in curatorial & registrar departments in museums in Kentucky, Tennessee, Massachusetts, & Ohio. Her curatorial projects include Letting the Days Go By: Block Print Calendars from the University of Louisville's Print Collection (2021) & the group curation of The Anthropocene Epoch (2021). She is an alumna from Harlaxton College and Western Kentucky University where she received a B.A. in Art History in 2018 and the University of Louisville where she received a M.A. in Art History with a Concentration in Critical and Curatorial Studies in 2021.

Arabeth Balasko, Cincinnati Museum Center

... is a curator of photographs, prints & media. She joined CMC in 2022 after six years as an archival & historical consultant. She also spent time at the Anchorage Museum in Alaska, where she oversaw over 1 million archival images, & with the Arlington Public Library in Virginia where, as the county's first digital archivist, she managed over 30.5 TB of digitized content. Balasko is a graduate of West Virginia University with degrees in international studies, history and Russian culture and language and earned a master's degree in history and archives from the University of Massachusetts Boston.
