### Go Green!

The Adopt-A-Tree Program is back again this year offering three tree options as we continue our efforts to maintain a 5% species threshold and to diversify the Village's tree population!

#### 2024 Tree Options:

- Autumn Gold Ginkgo
- Green Gable Black Gum
- Snowdance Tree Lilac

#### Location Options:

- Public Right-of-Way Trees: Cost per tree is \$250 and includes 1 tree, planting in the public right-of-way, mulching and initial watering.
- Private Property Trees: Cost per tree is \$300 and only includes the tree. Trees can be planted on private property.

The deadline to order your Adopt-A-Tree is May 1.

## Get Prepped for Yard Waste Collection

The first full yard waste collection of the year will be conducted the week of April 1.

- Yard waste must be out before 7am on Monday, April 1st to ensure your items will be picked up.
- Yard waste must be at least 3 feet away from mailboxes and other structures, branches must be less than 5' long, branches must be parallel to the road, and cannot be in plastic bags.
- Yard waste should be placed in bags or yard waste carts if possible.
- If your pile is greater than 10' long x 5' wide x 5' high, you will need a special pick-up which can be requested [here](#).

## 2nd Tax Installment Due Soon

If you chose to pay your property taxes using the installment plan, the 2nd installment is due on Sunday, March 31.

Property tax payments can be paid via US mail, online, or in Village Hall during regular business hours.

The drop box at Village Hall will be locked on March 12 through April 2 due to the Spring Election absentee voting rules.

The 3rd tax installment is due May 31, 2024.

- Bicycles
- Cell Phones
- Electronics (TVs/Monitors require a prepaid fee; no refrigerators)
- Garbage
- Recycling
- Eyeglasses
- Ink Cartridges
- Light bulbs
- Habitat for Humanity donations
- Goodwill donations
- Paint
- Textiles
- Scrap metal
- Yard waste
- Plastic shopping bags
- Paper recycling (to be shredded offsite by third-party)
- Motor oil
- Household Hazardous Waste

To participate, residents must provide three (3) non-perishable items or a monetary donation for the Hunger Task Force.

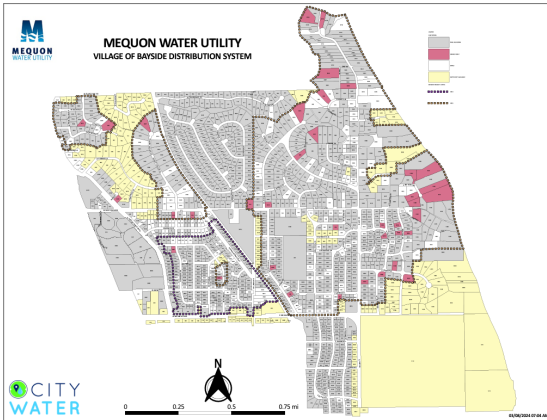

In 2015, 550 homes connected to municipal water through a resident driven volunteer participation project.

**No Mow May**



No Mow May is a conservation initiative that encourages people to stop mowing or mow less often for the month of May to create habitat and provide resources for bees and other early-season pollinators. The Village of Bayside is proud to join a number of other municipalities in the No Mow May initiative.

During the month of May, Bayside will suspend enforcement of long-grass rules, allowing property owners to delay or reduce lawn cutting to promote pollinator-friendly habitat early in the growing season. Participating residents must register their properties.

To become a 2024 No Mow May participant, Bayside residents must register through Access Bayside no later than May 7, 2024.
