What will happen:

- Some municipalities will sound sirens.
- Some TV/radio stations will briefly cut into programming

What will <u>NOT</u> happen:

- Wireless Emergency Alerts
- Push notifications on phones
- Test Watch/Warning

Yard Waste Collection

The next full yard waste collection of the year will be conducted the week of April 15.

- Yard waste must be out before 7am on Monday, April 15th to ensure your items will be picked up.
- Yard waste must be at least 3 feet away from mailboxes and other structures, branches must be less than 5' long, branches must be parallel to the road, and cannot be in plastic bags.
- Yard waste should be placed in bags or yard waste carts if possible.
- If your pile is greater than 10' long x 5' wide x 5' high, you will need a special pick-up which can be requested <u>here</u>.

The Adopt-A-Tree Program is back again this year offering three tree options as we continue our efforts to maintain a 5% species threshold and to diversify the Village's tree population!

2024 Tree Options:

- Autumn Gold Gingko
- Green Gable Black Gum
- Snowdance Tree Lilac

Location Options:

- Public Right-of-Way Trees: Cost per tree is \$250 and includes 1 tree, planting in the public right-of-way, mulching and initial watering.
- Private Property Trees: Cost per tree is \$300 and only includes the tree. Trees can be planted on private property.

The deadline to order your Adopt-A-Tree is **May 1**.

During this week, we encourage all residents to visit the library and celebrate the adventures and opportunities they unlock for us every day!






Distracted Driving Awareness Month

Protect Wisconsin's native spring flowers from harmful, invasive Arctic scilla and garlic mustard.




Did You Know?

The Bayside Public Safety Communications Center utilizes an emergency notification system, CodeRED, which allows North Shore Public Safety Departments to send emergency notifications to subscribers via email, text and phone calls.

In case of an emergency, individuals within the effected geographic area will be notified via text, phone, or email. There is no need to sign up for life-threatening emergency alerts.
