FALSE ALARMS

Homeowners and businesses can expect a quick response from the Police Department if a burglar or panic alarm goes off, even if called by the monitoring company. Some things to remember if you have an alarm:

- The 911 Center will not accept automated dialer systems; your alarm must be monitored by a professional company that will contact you, your designee, and the Police Department.
- Police will check the premises for obvious signs of entry; officers WILL NOT enter your home or business unless there is an obvious sign of forced entry.
- Residents and businesses are allowed one 'false alarm' without a penalty fee. Subsequent false alarms will result in progressively increasing fees.
- Alarm customers are encouraged to contact their service provider to review who is to be called if the alarm goes off.

NATIONAL BATTERY DAY

National Battery Day is celebrated annually on February 18. This year, ensure you are properly recycling your batteries. Batteries should not be placed in your curbside recycling containers to avoid truck and facility fires.
