**WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS**

With the rising temperatures and thawing conditions, the ground softens and has weakened integrity, putting Village of Bayside roads in a vulnerable state. The subgrade does not provide the expected level of support and can lead to cracking and premature road failure. To combat this issue, the Village places weight restrictions on Village of Bayside roadways to protect structure and lifespan. You may see weight restriction signs off major Village of Bayside thoroughfares. While these will not impact your vehicle, it may create temporary issues for contractors, delivery firms, and other businesses. ### SPRING ELECTION

The Spring General Election will be held on Tuesday, April 2. The Village of Bayside polling location is the Bayside Village Hall Board Room, located at 9075 N. Regent Road. Polls will be open from 7am to 8pm. If you are not already registered to vote, you may register early on the MyVote Wisconsin website ([www.myvote.wi.gov](http://www.myvote.wi.gov)). ### BAYSIDE RECYCLING DAYS

Recycling Days for Village of Bayside residents are held on the third Saturday of the month from March until November (except for Clean Up Day month), 9-11:30am.

2024 Recycling Days are on the following Saturdays:

- March 16
  - May 18
  - June 15
  - July 20
  - August 17
  - September 21
  - October 19
  - November 16
- The Holiday Recycling Day will be held on Thursday, December 26
- Items collected include yard waste, recycling, scrap metal, plastic bags, light bulbs, ink cartridges, eyeglasses, cell phones, textiles and electronics (TV and monitor fees must be paid in advance). ### YARD WASTE DOS AND DON'TS

- Place your piles and bags by the road, three (3) feet away from mailboxes and other structures.
- Branches must be less than 5' long and arranged parallel to the road.
- Do not put yard waste in plastic bags, garbage carts, or recycling carts.
- Do not put pet waste in yard waste piles, bags, or containers.
- Do not place yard waste on a property other than your own.
- Combine all materials into one (1) pile per property.
- Piles greater than 10' long x 5' wide x 5' high require a special pick-up. Special pick-ups can be requested online through Access Bayside.
- Contractor generated yard waste is not collected by the Village. Please make sure your contractor takes yard waste with them when done.
- Crews will pass by each home once. If you miss the yard waste collection, you can request a callback for a fee of \$45.
- Yard waste can be dropped off on Recycling and Clean Up Days.

### ARE YOU READY FOR SPRING?

As winter melts away (it will happen someday), the following tips can help prepare you for the spring thaw and the chance of flooding and contamination of our rivers and streams:

- Uncover and clear catch basins, yard drains, drainage structures, or detention pond outlets near your property.
- Clear debris from gutters and downspouts, and address ice dams or hire a professional to clear accumulations of ice.
- Move items off the basement floor to protect them from potential infiltration of floodwaters or rising groundwater.
- Move stored chemicals to areas where floodwater cannot reach.
- Make sure your sump pump is working properly and consider installing a battery-operated backup in the event of loss of power. Installing a water alarm system will also let you know if water is accumulating in your basement.
- Anchor or store any outdoor items that may float away and enter our waterways, such as lawn furniture, fuel tanks, and small equipment.
- Consider purchasing flood insurance to protect your property from future flooding events.
- Listen to National Weather Service forecast for flood-related advisories or warnings.
- Finally, the number one tip during flood events: Use common sense and be safe!
