FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Fall leaf collection began the third Monday of October. At this time, you can place loose leaves roadside. Please do not place loose leaves roadside until the weekend prior to collection.

- Please set leaves roadside out of the ditch and not in the road for pickup.
- Please have all loose leaves consolidated into one pile per property.
- Leaves should not be put in bags for collection during loose leaf season. If leaves are bagged, they will be picked up only on yard waste collection weeks.
- Place material away from mailboxes or other structures so that it may be easily accessible. Do not mix leaves with other yard waste, such as branches or twigs.
- Please keep all leaves out of the ditch and culvert area; this will help during the wet fall and spring season.
- Open burning of leaves is prohibited.

TAX BILLS COMING IN DECEMBER

Bayside residents will be receiving their 2023 tax bills in the mail by mid-December. Full payment or the first installment is due by January 31, 2024. The 2023 installment plan has the following 2024 deadlines: January 31, March 31, May 31.

Payments for the tax bill can be made in the following ways:

By Mail: Village of Bayside, 9075 N. Regent Road, Bayside, WI 53217. If you would like a receipt, please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope or an email address.

In-person at Bayside Village Hall: During regular business hours or drop in the night deposit box. Bayside Village Hall is closed December 25 and 26.

Online: Visit <https://pp-milwaukee-co-wi-fb.app.landnav.com/> Login and sign in as a guest. Search your address and select the 2023 tax bill. Click the 'Taxes' tab at the top of the page and add your desired payment amount to your cart. View your cart and click 'Checkout'!

SWITCH YOUR RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

It is time for storing the summer recreation vehicles, campers, boats, and jet skis, and bringing out winter recreation vehicles such as snowmobiles in Bayside. They must be regularly used and parked on your driveway or another paved area. Winter recreational vehicles can be parked outside from November 1 through April 15 in Bayside.

MOUNT BAYSIDE!

Once the snow flies and temperatures freeze, Mount Bayside will be open again! Gather your family and friends to enjoy chilly winter days at Mount Bayside. The sled hill is located next to Bayside Village Hall on Regent Road. Park in the sled hill parking lot located off Fairy Chasm Road.

DON'T BE A VICTIM - PREVENT PORCH PIRACY

As purchases for friends and family start arriving at your doorstep, take these steps to avoid being a victim:

- Have your package delivered to your work.
- Have your package delivered to the home of a relative or friend that you know will be home.
- Ask a neighbor to remove the package and hold it for you.
- Have your package held at your local post office for pickup.
- Take advantage of 'Ship to Store' options that many stores offer. Some vendors offer an option that allows you to pick up your package from a secure location.
- Request that your package has signature confirmation upon delivery.
- Ask your carrier to place your packages in an area out of plain view.
- Pay for a package receiving service.
- Get a 'Porch Pirate' security bag that is difficult to cut and that locks by a cable.
- Buy a package siren device. When the package is moved, it sounds a siren.
- Set up a security camera, such as a doorbell camera.
- Install motion detector lights.

PUT THE STING ON CRIME

Home security cameras allow residents to deter would-be criminals, protect packages left on the doorstep, and even communicate with strangers on their property without ever having to open the front door. These cameras are also a great tool for law enforcement as they capture images of criminal suspects and their vehicles, not just on your own property, but in areas adjacent to your property.

Registration with the B.E.E. Program is voluntary, confidential, and has no fees associated with it. Registering your camera does not provide the Bayside Police Department with direct access to your camera(s). The Bayside Police Department will only contact you directly to request the appropriate video surveillance footage during an investigation if there is an incident in the vicinity of your surveillance system. PROTECT YOUR PETS

Often when pets become separated from their owners, the pet's identification tags are missing or become separated from the pet. To help facilitate the safe return of lost pets, the Police Department created the PetPatrol program. Register your pet today through Access Bayside at www.baysidewi.gov.
