No Mow May is a conservation initiative that encourages people to stop mowing or mow less often for the month of May to create habitat and provide resources for bees and other early-season pollinators. The Village of Bayside is proud to join a number of other municipalities in the No Mow May initiative.

During the month of May, Bayside will suspend enforcement of long-grass rules, allowing property owners to delay or reduce lawn cutting to promote pollinator-friendly habitat early in the growing season. Participating residents must register their properties.

Compost Awareness Week

May 5-11 is International Compost Awareness Week! This week gives us an opportunity to celebrate and promote composting in our Village. Composting is the transformation of raw materials – such as leaves, grass clippings, garden trimmings, and food scraps – into compost, a valuable earthy-smelling soil conditioner! Healthy soils are essential for protecting watersheds and compost is the best way to add organic matter to soils. When added to soil, compost can filter out urban stormwater pollutants by 60-95%!

What can you do today? Learn how to compost at home and amend your soil with compost. Install a rain garden to add more compost into your yard. You can help the planet one composted food scrap at a time!



Youth Citizens Academy

The Bayside Youth Citizens Academy is a new program offered to residents of Bayside, ages 13-17. The program aims to provide a closer look at the operations of local government and the jobs of those who work for the Village.

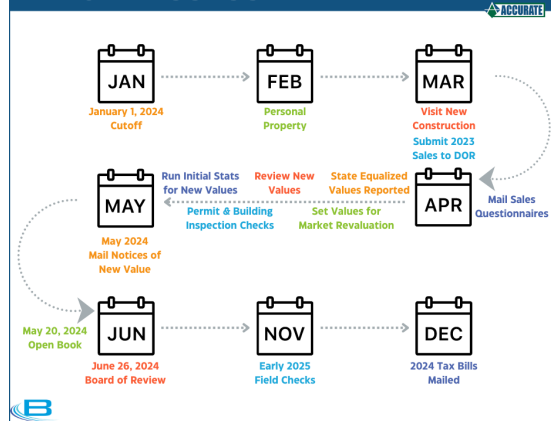

2024 Property Assessments

The Village Assessor, Accurate Assessor, has completed their initial fieldwork and Notices of New Value will be mailed on or around May 3. The anticipated average residential increase is 4.74%.

Open Book is again available where property owners can meet with an assessor to discuss the value of their property. Appointments will take place virtually by viewing a short video and signing up at <https://accurateassessor.powerappsportals.com/Open-Book/>. Virtual appointments are available May 6 to June 18 on a first come first served basis. In person open book will take place at Village Hall on May 20 from 1pm-3pm.
