- Celebrate the 150th Arbor Day with Stormonth Elementary School on April 29 from 1:45-2:15pm (7301 N Longacre Rd, Fox Point)
- Join volunteers to help remove invasive Arctic Scilla and Garlic Mustard on May 14 at 9am at Doctors Park.
- Recycle paper for shredding at Village Hall.



Spring Clean Up Day - April 23

Mark your calendars! The Spring Clean-Up Day will be held on Saturday, April 23 from 9am to 12pm in the Department of Public Works parking lot. Acceptable materials include:

- Bicycles
- Cell Phones
- Electronics (TVs/Monitors require prepaid fee; no items containing freon - refrigerator, dehumidifier)
- Garbage
- Recycling
- Eyeglasses

- Ink Cartridges
- Light bulbs
- Habitat for Humanity donations
- Goodwill donations
- Paint (Will need to empty paint into separate container at event)
- Scrap metal
- Yard waste
- Plastic shopping bags
- Paper recycling (to be shredded offsite by third-party).
- Motor oil
- Household Hazardous Waste

To participate, residents must provide three (3) non-perishable items or a monetary donation for the Hunger Task Force.



Ellsworth Park Playground Community Build

2022 Adopt a Tree Program

The [Adopt-A-Tree program](#) is back with two options in 2022.

Option 1: Public Right of Way trees

- The cost per tree is \$160, and includes 1 tree, planting in public right-of-way, mulching, & initial watering.

Option 2: Private property trees

- The cost per tree is \$200, and only includes the tree. Trees can be planted on private property.



In the continued effort to maintain a 5% species threshold and to diversify the Village's tree population, the following trees will be available this year:

- Turkish Filbert
- Greenspire Linden
- Spring Snow Crabapple
- Katsura

Yard Waste Carts Available

Do you need somewhere to store your yard waste? You can now purchase a dark gray yard waste cart, similar style to your garbage and recycling carts.

Carts can be purchased through [Access Bayside](#) for the same price as your garbage and recycling carts, \$75. Payments can be made [online](#) or in person at Village Hall.



Drug Take Back Day

Too often, unused and unwanted medications find their way into the wrong hands. That's dangerous and often tragic. Bringing unused and unwanted medications to a Drug Take Back Day collection site protects you, your family, and your community.

The next Drug Take Back Day is April 30, 2022.

A total of 57,377 pounds of unused and unwanted medications were collected in Wisconsin during the last Drug Take Back period that ended with the October 23, 2021 Drug Take Back Day. This was the largest collection in the United States.

The Bayside Police Department is a host and drop off center during the Drug Take Back Day.
