Highlights / Accomplishments

- The Police Department collected and disposed of 13 boxes of prescription drugs weighing 322 pounds as part of the National Drug Take Back Day. The drugs were disposed of at a DEA collection site in Waukesha.
- Officers attended the Bayside Middle School lockdown drill as observers and visitors. This was a rehearsal for anything that might require students and teachers to stay in place with locked doors, closed windows, lights turned off and blinds drawn such as nearby police activity, a natural disaster or a violent intruder.
- Chief Larsson presented a 20-minute PowerPoint discussion to a virtual audience of the Alliance For Innovation (AFI) on how to improve relations between law enforcement and a community. Key points included the goals of the *myBlue* Program and the principals of fair and transparent policing.
- Police from the North Shore, along with North Shore Fire Department and Bayside Public Works collaborated to create a public service notice to remind people to move over and slow down when they see emergency crews, repair crews, road crews and other public workers along the road as they do their work.
- Use of CVMIC's training platform remains very high. So far, 196 courses have been attended by the 14 members of the Police Department in the areas of technology, law, operations, and communications.
