

Highlights / Accomplishments

- The Chief met with the entire department to discuss the results of a short survey on the culture and values of the department that was taken by police officers. Police officers spoke clearly as to why they work in the jobs that they have and what expectations they have for police leadership;
- Chief Larsson is completing a survey at the request of the Wisconsin Policy Forum that describes the department's level of staffing, equipment, and activity;
- The Village is a recipient of the newly announced ARPA grants for municipal police departments. Bayside will receive \$9,724 to be used for supplies, equipment, training and support;
- Officer Mike Klawitter attended an all-expenses paid course at the International Law Enforcement Educator and Trainer Association conference in St. Louis. He was awarded a scholarship in the amount of \$2,055.00;
- The police officer candidate has completed all required testing to be hired. An offer of employment was extended to him. Jack Cranny of Glen Ellyn, Illinois will start on April 12.
- Officers re-certified in AED/CPR. The certification is good for two years;
- Chief and lieutenants met to discuss new payroll system, new dashboard, and recent leadership training;
- Officer Santarelli has created a draft of the new "Bayside Blotter", which is a bi-weekly Facebook and Twitter publication that will carry safety tips, FAQs, and police activity for the public to peruse.
