Note, assessed values may increase or decrease each year depending on recent market conditions. Your assessed value doesn't directly correlate to a change in the amount you pay for property taxes. Your assessment is based on the value of all buildings and land on your parcel as of January 1st, each year. Assessors must follow state statutes to set fair and equitable values. Your new value is based on valid sales, from the prior year, that occur in your area.

Yard Waste Collection Next Week

The next full yard waste collection of 2022 will be conducted the week of June 6.

- Yard waste must be out before 7am on Monday, June 6th to ensure your items will be picked up.
- Yard waste must be at least 3 feet away from mailboxes and other structures, branches must be less than 5' long, branches must be parallel to the road, and cannot be in plastic bags.
- Yard waste should be placed in bags or containers if possible.
- If your pile is greater than 10' long x 5' wide x 5' high, you will need a special pick-up which can be requested <u>here</u>.

On average, a plastic shopping bag is used for just 12 minutes. It takes up to 1,000 years for a plastic bag to break down. Unfortunately, the bags don't break down completely, but instead photo-degrade, becoming microplastics that absorb toxins and continue to pollute the environment.

This year, 5 trillion plastic bags will be consumed. That's 160,000 bags a second! Put one after another, they would go around the world 7 times every house and cover twice the size of France.

Rather than driving to your local merchant or Village Hall to recycle your plastic bags, save your time, money, and the planet by purchasing reusable bags.




Got Grass?

Senior Citizen Scams - Medicare Fraud

What to look out for: Police are always alert for mobile "health-care labs" sometimes park at retirement homes, malls, or health clubs where fake or unnecessary tests are administered on "patients" whose identifying information is used to bill insurance companies and Medicare. Similar rackets involving unneeded medical equipment also target seniors.

Risks: Often directed at the elderly by perpetrators who leverage the term "Medicare," this scam seeks personal information and could expose seniors to identity theft.
