The Village Board has the responsibility for a wide range of policies and procedures including the management of Village finances, the acquisition and allocation of funds for Village operations, and final approval of a budget. It has the authority for management of local property, including the adoption of zoning ordinances, and final decisions on development proposals.

Our History

Bayside was once an area comprised of a few large homes, summer cottages, and farms. In 1911, the original Donges and Usinger estates were marked by the stone lion gates which currently stand at the corner of Lake Drive and Fairy Chasm Road. In 2007, the lion gates were recognized for historical designation.

Prior to modern settlement, the areas first inhabitants, the Paleo-Indian tribes, were hunters and fishermen. The Sauk Indian Trail (now Port Washington Road) was a heavily used, major trail. Chief Waubeka and the last of the Potawatomi Indians left the area in 1845.

Incorporation of Bayside

In 1953, a small group of residents living in part of the former Town of Milwaukee met to discuss independent incorporation or annexation by the City of Milwaukee. The step into the future was made when 467 persons incorporated the Village of Bayside on February 13, 1953. Growth continued and in 1955 the Fish Creek area in Ozaukee County was annexed.

Today, Bayside comprises approximately 2.39 square miles. About 81% of the total acreage is zoned for residential use, 15% is natural conservancy, and 4% comprises commercial, recreational, and transportation use.

Getting the neighborhood together? Submit a <u>Special Event Permit</u> along with the associated fees and the area will be ready for your neighborhood gathering!

Culvert Replacement Program

Is your culvert collapsing, rusting, or rotting? The Department of Public Works will remove your old pipe and install a new ADS plastic pipe, stone compaction, and asphalt overlay through the <u>Culvert</u> <u>Replacement Program</u> for a fee.

Do Not Solicit List

The Do Not Solicit List is a list of addresses where individuals who are going door to door are not permitted to sell products or services. <u>Sign up</u> today!

Home Security Assessment

Is your home safe? Could it be safer? The myBlue <u>Home Security Assessment</u> will provide you with advice, tips, and recommendations to make sure your home and family are safe.

Mailbox Replacement Program

Is your mailbox straight, stable, and sturdy? The Department of Public Works will replace your old or damaged mailbox with a new mailbox consisting of 1 standard box and 1 standard wood post through the <u>Mailbox Replacement Program</u> for a fee.

Mulch Deliveries

Time to spruce up your yard? The Department of Public Works can <u>deliver mulch to your home</u> for a fee or you can pick up mulch for free in the Mount Bayside parking lot at anytime throughout the season.

Parking Permission

Having a party? Repaving your driveway? Need to park on the street? <u>Request parking permission</u> from the Bayside Police Department.

Special Needs Registry

Bayside Village Hall

Bayside Village Hall is open to serve you Monday-Friday, 8am – 4pm. Departments at Village Hall include Building Services, Police, Finance, Human Resources, Planning and Zoning, and Public Works. Village Hall is also the meeting place of the Village's Board of Trustees. Numerous Village services are available online to save you a trip to Village Hall. Visit www.baysidewi.gov to learn more.

Voter Information

Any Bayside resident who is a U.S. citizen and is at least 18 years old is eligible to register to vote. In order to register to vote in the Village of Bayside, you must have been living in your residence at least 10 days prior to the election. State law does not allow voter registration on the Saturday, Sunday, or Monday prior to election day.

How to Register to Vote:

ONLINE:

Register to vote at **myvote.wi.gov**.

As long as your address is up-to-date with the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), you can register online up through the 20th day before the election. If you do not update your address with the DMV, or if you register after the 20th day before the election, you will need to print off the application and bring it to Village Hall (or your polling site on election day) and you must include your proof of residence when returning your voter registration application.

IN-PERSON:

Residents may register at the Village Hall, 9075 N Regent Rd, Monday-Friday, 8am - 4pm. Please bring Proof of Residence Documents.

MAIL:

Visit <u>www.baysidewi.gov</u> to download and print a voter registration form. Mail or drop off to the attention of the Clerk's Office at 9075 N Regent Rd, Bayside, WI, 53217.

Election Dates:

Spring Elections are annually on the 1st Tuesday in April, with a primary (if necessary) on the 3rd Tuesday in February. **Fall Elections** are held even-numbered years on the 1st Tuesday following the first Monday in November, with a primary on the 2nd Tuesday in August.

In-Person Voting

All elections are held at Bayside Village Hall **9075 N Regent Rd**

On Election Day, polls are open **7am - 8pm**

A Photo ID is required to receive a ballot, a list of accepted photo IDs can be found on myvote.wi.gov

Absentee Voting

You can request absentee ballots for any election online at www.myvote.wi.gov. and in person at the Village Hall

Garbage and Recycling

The Village of Bayside provides residential garbage, recycling, and yard waste collection services to residential properties. View our Collection Guide at www.baysidewi.gov/collection-guide/.

Garbage and Recycling Collections

- Garbage is collected weekly
 - o Monday: North Route, Fairy Chasm and North
 - Tuesday: South Route, South of Fairy Chasm
- Recycling is collected bi-weekly on Wednesdays
- Carts *must* be out by 7am on your collection day
- Crews will only pass by each home once
 - There is a fee for same day callbacks
- If you miss scheduled garbage day pick up, you may request a special pick up for a fee



Garbage and Recycling Carts

- Use only Village provided carts
- Cart handles should face the home
- Carts should be three feet from other carts or structures

Not Accepted with Garbage Collection

Items left outside of carts, recyclables, yard waste, grass clippings, electronics, and household hazardous waste

Acceptable Recycling Items

Flattened Cardboard, paper, glass bottles and containers, food and beverage can containers, plastic bottles and containers

Not Acceptable Recycling Items

Styrofoam, plastic film, plastic bags, electronics, food or yard waste, sharps or inhalers

Holidays Impacting Collections

New Year's Eve/ Day (Observed)

Memorial Day

4th of July (Observed)

Labor Day

Christmas Eve/Day (Observed)

Special / Large Item Pick Up

- Special Pick-Ups are available the 1st and 3rd
 Thursday of each month
- Items *must* be out by 7am on day of the collection
- Submit service request through Access Bayside at least 24 hours in advance of desired pick-up date
- There is a minimum fee for special pickups

Not Acceptable Bulk and Special Items

Refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners, tires, gasoline, propane gas containers, lead pipe, lead based paint, liquid latex paint, cooking oils, asbestos, fertilizers, household hazardous waste, and contractor generated waste

Clean Up Days

Clean Up Days are held annually in the spring and fall from 9 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. To participate in the event, a monetary or food donation to the Hunger Task Force is required.

Yard Waste Collections

- Loose and Bagged yard waste are collected certain weeks every year
- Check the collection guide for the specific weeks
- Yard Waste must be out by 7am the first day of your collection week
- Crews will only pass by each home once
- If you miss the yard waste collection, you may request a special pick up for a fee

Acceptable Yard Waste

Branches, Leaves, Trimmings, Plants

Unacceptable Yard Waste

Grass Clippings, Thatch, Sod, Bricks, Rocks, Concrete, Soil, Dirt, Contractor Generated Debris, Items in Plastic Bags

Yard Waste Instructions

- Place your piles and bags by the road, 3 feet away from other structures
- Branches must be less than 5' long
- Arrange sticks parallel to the road
- Combine all materials into 1 pile per property.
- Piles greater than 10' long x 5' wide x 5' high require a special pick-up.
 - Special pick-ups can be requested through Access Bayside.

Call Backs

- Crews will pass by each home once
- If items were missed due to not being out by 7am the first day of collection, call backs can be arranged for a fee.

Loose Leaf Collection

- Loose Leaves are collected certain weeks every fall
- Check the collection guide for the specific weeks
- Leaves *must* be out at the edge of the road by 7am the first day of collection week.

Yard Waste Bins

- Bins are collected at all yard waste pickups
- Request one through Access Bayside or go to village hall for a fee

Loose Leaf Instructions

- Please set out leaves only, as branches and other matter can damage the leaf collection equipment
- Place all leaves in one 1 pile per property
- Leaf piles should be at least 3 feet away from other objects
- Loose leaves should not be bagged for the fall collection
 - Leaves should be bagged all other times

Sewer and Water Utilities

If you recently moved, certain utilities may have been shut off and you may have to call the power company, gas provider, or water utility to turn services back on. If they are already on, you will have to arrange to have the bills put in your name.

Municipal Water vs. Well

Based on the property location, some homes have access to municipal water while others operate on a well. Some properties however, have chosen to operate on both municipal water and keep their well. View the map below to see where your property lies.

Private Well Information

Please note that not all homes have municipal water. Roughly 15% of homes have a private well. If your home is serviced by a private well, this comes with a few inherent responsibilities, such as periodic testing and pump maintenance. Almost all forms of testing can be obtained by contacting the Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene. Homeowners can obtain well testing kits by visiting the website, or by calling 800-442-4618.

If you live at a home with a private well, you have the option to either keep your existing well after connection to the municipal water system or properly abandon the well.


Who Provides Water Utilities?

The City of Mequon Water Utility contracts with City Water LLC for work to be performed out in the field for water services. While the city finance employees handle billing and other financial aspects for the utility, City Water LLC performs maintenance/repair on water mains, meter swaps and installation, water shutoffs/connection and field checks on potential issue accounts.

Sanitary Sewer Information

Bayside is one of 28 satellite communities that are served by the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD). All sanitary sewer is eventually sent to a treatment plant. For more information, visit www.mmsd.com.

The Village maintains 135,000 feet of sanitary sewer lines. Sanitary sewer is separate from stormwater. Sanitary sewer collects water from sinks, showers, toilets, etc.



Pets

My Pet is Lost, What should I do?

Bayside Communications Center maintains a log of lost pets. If your pet is lost, or you locate a lost pet in the North Shore, please contact us to see if someone called in a pet that was lost or located at 414-351-9900.

Call Milwaukee Area Domestic Animal Control 414-649-8640. Any located animals are taken to this facility in hopes that the owner will be located, and the pet will be returned to its home.

Leashing

Owners must keep their pets on a leash when outside of their property. Pets should be leashed so they can not trespass on public or private property or in any way cause harm or danger to persons or other animals.

Pet Licenses

- Pets are required to be licensed in the Village of Bayside.
- License must be renewed every year
- Required for pets 5+ months old
- Proof of current rabies vaccination must be provided

Licenses can be obtained from MADACC or from Village Hall. Due date for obtaining your pet's license yearly is **March 31st.**

The fee for spayed/ neutered pets is \$12, and the fee for unaltered pets is \$24.

Property Tax Information

Frequently Asked Questions:

When will I get my Tax Bill?

Property tax bills are mailed to residents by mid-December of each year.

When are my Taxes Due?

The first installment or the full amount is due by January 31.

The second and third installments are due by March 31 and May 31, respectfully.

Where can I pay my Tax Bill?

Tax payments can be paid at Village Hall: 9075 N. Regent Rd. Bayside, WI 53217 Put in the dropbox outside Village Hall, or paid online at www.baysidewi.gov/property-taxes/

Where can I get an online copy of my Tax Bill?

You can view your property tax bill online at www.baysidewi.gov/property-taxes/

Property Assessments Information:

The Village of Bayside performs a revaluation of all property annually. This means all property within the Village will be reviewed then assessed to fair market value annually. Your assessed value can increase or decrease each year depending on current market conditions or home improvements. A change in your assessed value does not directly correlate to a change in your property taxes.

Assessment Process:

Accurate Assessor reviews previous year's sales and market data then verifies all permits and sales. The assessor then compares market data to revalue all property before sending notices to homes with new values. To contact Accurate Assessor, visit www.accurateassessor.com or call 920-749-8098.



Building Services

Permits:

Alterations to the building structure including the building's heating, electrical, or plumbing systems generally require a permit. Check the Village's Building Permit Guide and Electrical/Plumbing/HVAC Permit Guide for more information on when and what permits are required. If you are in doubt about whether your project will require a permit, please contact Village Hall at (414) 206-3915 prior to beginning the project.

The costs of permits will vary and a complete list of permit fees can be found in the <u>Village's Fee</u>
<u>Schedule</u> on the Village's Website. The costs are determined by estimated cost of the project or square footage.

How to Submit a Building Permit Application:

- Submit inside Village Hall during operating hours
- Submit in the Village Drop Off box at any time
- Mail application to Village Hall
- Email application to Building Services Department
- Submit online through the Village's Website
- Submit through Access Bayside
- Submit on your phone through Access Bayside App

When completed, permits and fees are paid to the Village of Bayside who will then send the permit application to SAFEbuilt, Inc. SAFEbuilt Inc. will mail you the permit with the permit number to be displayed in a front window of your home.

Inspections:

The Village of Bayside contracts with SAFEbuilt Inc. to provide permit and inspection services. SAFEbuilt is a State Certified inspection agency now serving over 100 municipalities. To contact SAFEbuilt Inc., please call (262) 346-4577 or email hartfordinspections@safebuilt.com.

Architectural Review Committee: (ARC)

The purpose of the Architectural Review Committee is to ensure that all construction and structures within the Village comply with the Municipal Code, and to ensure that all structures within the Village meet minimum standards of architectural quality, consistency, aesthetic design, and finish.

Certain projects require prior approval of the Architectural Review Committee.

If the project requires approval, complete the appearance application found on Villages Website. Applications must be submitted two weeks preceding the meeting by 10AM.

Items that Require Approval from ARC:

- Accessory Structures, if larger than 48 cubic feet
- Additions/Remodels
- Bluff Management
- Commercial signage
- Decks, if over 18 inches in height or 150 square feet
- Fences
- Fire Pits, if over 18 inches in height
- Generators, permanently installed and larger than 48 cubic feet

- Landscaping requiring Impervious Surface/Fill/Excavation Permit
- New Construction
- Play Structures, exceeds 15 feet
- Recreational Facilities
- Roof, if changing aesthetics
- Swimming Pools
- Windows/Doors, if over 25% change in size, placement, or if style changes
- Any other changes to a property that affect exterior appearance

Bayside Police Department

Prescription Drug Drop-Off

The Bayside Police Department accepts old or unused medicine 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The process is simple. Just bring in prescriptions to the Police Department lobby and place into the prescription drug drop box. (See Below)



Acceptable Items: Prescription and over-the-counter medications, Ointments, Sprays, Inhalers, Creams, Vials, Pet medication

Unacceptable Items: Needles/sharps, Biohazardous material, Personal care products, Household Hazardous Waste, Illegal Drugs

Other services provided:

- Special Event/Block Parties
- Transient Merchant Permits
- Vacation Checks
- Street Parking Approval
- Home Safety Assessments
- Neighbor Mediation

Critical Policies

The Bayside Police Department is accredited by the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group (WILEAG) and adheres to all best core practices as defined in the State Statutes and the by-laws of WILEAG. Part of the commitment to the residents and visitors in Bayside is to provide a transparent connection by publishing key policies that govern the actions by Bayside Police Officers. myBlue Initiative

What is myBlue?

The myBlue program is the tailored delivery of non-urgent advice, resources, and individualized police services to small sections of the residential community in Bayside.

How does myBlue work?

8 delineated neighborhoods, or sectors, have been laid out upon which the Sector Officers focus. These police liaisons will dedicate their time to their assigned geographic area and will work to gather opinions and points of view about neighborhood issues and needs, neighborhood behaviors, Village services, and any unspoken fear of crime or threats to lifestyle.

Why Contact my Officer?

Your myBlue Officer can offer information or advice, help you schedule a block party, help with neighbor concerns, ect.

How do I Contact my Officer?

Find and contact your assigned officer by visiting the Bayside website.

Vacation Check Services:

If you are planning to be away from home for a vacation or for an extended period of time, you can contact the Bayside Police Department at (414) 206-3916 or <u>submit a request</u> through the Village's website to schedule a Vacation Home Check.

CodeRED Alerts

CodeRED is a community notification system available to North Shore residents that will send you alerts concerning time-sensitive and/or emergency information that may impact your area via phone calls, text messages, emails, and social media.

The Center

Service Level Improvements

- Reduction or elimination of 911 call transfers

Technological Advancements

- Ability to effectively and efficiently handle an increase in cellular based 911 calls
- Implementation of Next Generation 911

Text-to-911

Text-to-911 is NOT a method of convenience. The service is intended to benefit people who may not be able to speak or hear in an emergency. A voice call is still the preferred and most efficient method for contacting 911. Simply stated, call if you can, text if you can't.

Text 911 if you need EMERGENCY police, fire, or medical aid AND you are deaf, hard of hearing, or speech disabled OR you cannot speak due to a medical emergency OR when a voice call might endanger your life or escalate the situation.

How To:

- 1. Open your mobile phone's text messaging program.
- 2. Enter the numbers 911 in the "To" field.
- 3. Type a message with the location of the emergency (including city) and the nature of the emergency (what is happened and whether you need police, fire, or medical aid).
- 4. Press the "Send" button or arrow.

Be sure to keep your phone with you and be prepared to answer questions and follow instructions from the 911 dispatcher.

Fire Department

The North Shore Fire Department (NSFD) was organized throughout the years 1992-1994. The NSFD protects the City of Glendale and the Villages of Bayside, Brown Deer, Fox Point, River Hills, Shorewood, and Whitefish Bay.

Home Safety Assessment:

In an effort to keep residents safe from fire and promote community safety, North Shore Fire/Rescue conduct free courtesy home safety evaluations.

Appointments can be scheduled on the NSFD's website.

During the evaluation, various safety-related topics will be discussed, such as:

- Electrical Safety
- Fire Escape Planning
- General Home Safety
- Proper Storage/Use of Chemicals, Combustibles and Flammables
- Smoke Alarms and Their Maintenance



Car Seat Installation Program:

The North Shore Fire Department installs car seats for North Shore residents, which includes Bayside residents, on an appointment only basis.

Appointments can be made on the NSFD's website and are available Monday through Friday during normal business hours.

Appointments are around 30 to 40 minutes and include inspection of seat, installation, and required educational information.

CPR & First Aid Certification:

North Shore Fire/Rescue provides CPR, First Aid and Blood Borne Pathogen training and certification courses for a fee. Classes are typically 3 to 4 hours in length depending on the number of students and the topics to be covered. Following completion of the course, participants will be issued American Heart Association certification that is valid for 2 years. The cost of these courses is \$70 per person.

Intern Firefighter Program:

The North Shore Fire Department runs an Intern Firefighter program. This unpaid internship is designed to help transition candidates into a career in the fire service. Interns are expected to perform, at a minimum, the equivalent of a 24-hour ride along per month.


Fox Point - Bayside School District 414-247-4167

Ellsworth Park:

Doctors Park:



Top 10 FAQs

Q: My garbage or recycling was not picked up on the scheduled day, who should I call?

A: The Department of Public Works ask that you have your items out by 7:00am. If you had them out by that time, please contact Village Hall. If not, callbacks will be charged for an additional fee.

Q: Do I need a dumpster permit?

A: Yes, a permit is needed for any dumpster, bagster, pod, or other unenclosed storage receptacle that exceeds 2.5 cubic yards. Please find the dumpster permit application online at www.baysidewi.gov.

Q: Why was my yard waste not collected?

A: First, check for a pink tag. It will have information explaining why the pile wasn't collected. Two main offenses are restricted material (i.e. grass, dirt) and the pile is larger than the allowable size.

Q: How do I get an inspection for my building project?

A: The Village contracts inspection services through SAFEbuilt, Inc. To schedule an inspection, contact SAFEbuilt, Inc. at 262-420-4732 or by email at Wlinspections@safebuilt.com.

Q: What is the yellow ribbon on my tree?

A: The yellow ribbon indicates that the DPW will be removing the tree as part of EAB and urban forest management.

Q: What time is Ellsworth Park open?

A: Ellsworth Park is open from dawn to dusk.

Q: Doesn't my address show up when I dial 911?

A: If you are calling from a cell phone, the address does not come up. The BCC may get latitude and longitude location coordinates for you as the caller if your phone call hits the tower correctly, however it won't pinpoint your exact location.

Q: Who can I call if I'm locked out of my car or home?

A: If you lock yourself out of your car or home, call 414-351-9900. A Bayside Police Officer will come to your location and assist you. If a child is in the car, call 911.

Q: Does the Village have a survey of my property?

A: First, check the paperwork received at the closing of your home for a survey. The Village does not have surveys for each property, however, if a survey had been submitted in the past for a project, it may be in the property file. The Village does not provide surveying services.

Q: Can you tell me what my tax bill amount will be for next year?

A: The Village of Bayside tax bill that homeowners receive in December is based on the requests from several different taxing jurisdictions. There are three different districts in Bayside and two different county's that submit requests for money. Those requests are submitted in October and late November. The tax bill mill rate cannot be calculated until are requests and credits are received.
