Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District will be hosting a household hazardous waste collection in the DPW parking lot on Saturday, October 15 from 8am to 2pm.

Acceptable items - Please enter off Regent Road and exit on Fairy Chasm Road.



Yard Waste Collection

The next full yard waste collection will begin on Monday, October 17.

- Yard waste must be out before 7am to ensure your items will be picked up.
- Yard waste must be at least 3 feet away from structures.
- branches must be less than 5' long.
- branches must be parallel to the road, and cannot be in plastic bags.
- Yard waste should be placed in bags or containers, if possible.
- Piles greater than 10' long x 5' wide x 5' high require a <u>fee-based special</u> <u>pick-up</u>.



The <u>Bayside Police Department</u> has launched their newest program, PetPatrol.



Register to Vote

You can register to vote and request an absentee ballot. October 19 is the deadline to register to vote by mail or online.





November 8 Election Reminders

For any voter that has requested a ballot for the November 8 Election, absentee ballots have been mailed or will be mailed within 24 hours.

Voters who choose to vote by mail need to ensure the envelope has the witness signature and address in full in addition to the voter signature. Please be sure to follow the instructions included with your ballot in full. The Village Clerk's office is not able to make any correction to the envelope on your behalf.

In-person absentee voting will occur on weekdays from Tuesday, October 25, 2022, to Friday, November 4, 2022, during regular business hours (Monday through Friday, 8:00am to 4:00pm, until 5:00pm on Friday, November 4, 2022).



Drop Box Closed

The drop box at Village Hall will be closed beginning on Thursday, September 22 through Election Day.

You may only return YOUR ballot to the Village Hall in-person. You may also mail the ballot.

Garbage and Recycling Reminder

Garbage and recycling carts must be out by 7am on collection day to guarantee that they will be picked up. The route may change from time to time depending on the driver and therefore carts will not always be



picked up at the same time. The route is run from 7am to 4pm. We appreciate your patience!



2022 Road Project

The paving portion of the project has been completed! The next and final step of the project is to complete restoration of the shoulder and landscaping in the project area which will occur next week.

Tennyson Drive Storm Sewer Project

Building on previously installed Green Infrastructure Improvements, the Tennyson Drive Stormwater Management Infrastructure Project will address localized flooding during significant storm events and allow stormwater from the drainage basin to collect and direct runoff to the ravine located near Standish Place, southeast of the Tennyson Drive area of concern that currently experiences flooding.


