- 1. Place in your yard waste pile.
- 2. Place in your leaf pile.
- 3. Bring to the pumpkin disposal carts at Village Hall.



#### Time to Vote

In-person absentee voting will occur on weekdays from Tuesday, October 25, 2022, to Friday, November 4, 2022, during regular business hours (Monday through Friday, 8:00am to 4:00pm, until 5:00pm on Friday, November 4, 2022).

Wednesday, October 19 was the deadline to register by mail or online for the November 8 General Election. You will need to register in-person at the Clerk's office (Village Hall, 9075 N. Regent Road) or at the polls on Election Day.

Absentee ballots can be returned in-person at the Clerk's office, mailed back using the provided envelope, or brought to your polling location on Election Day.

Voters who choose to vote by mail need to ensure the envelope has the witness signature and address in full in addition to the voter signature. Please be sure to follow the instructions included with your ballot in full. The Village Clerk's office is not able to make any correction to the envelope on your behalf.




#### **Yard Waste Collection**

The next full yard waste collection will begin on Monday, October 31.

- Yard waste must be out before 7am to ensure your items will be picked up.
- Yard waste must be at least 3 feet away from structures.
- branches must be less than 5' long.
- branches must be parallel to the road, and cannot be in plastic bags.
- Yard waste should be placed in bags or containers, if possible.
- Piles greater than 10' long x 5' wide x 5' high require a <u>fee-based special</u> <u>pick-up</u>.

## Straight, Stable, Sturdy

Having a mailbox that is straight, stable, and sturdy is critical to ensure that your mail delivery service isn't interrupted. Every year, no matter how careful the DPW is when removing snow, mailboxes get knocked down by heavy snow.

Most instances of mailboxes being knocked over is a result of a mailbox not being straight, stable, or sturdy. Over time, mailbox posts become weakened by weather, age, and trimming long grass around the bottom.

This is a great time of year to take a close look at your mailbox post and replace it before the snow comes!

# Tennyson Drive Storm Sewer Project

Building on previously installed Green Infrastructure Improvements, the Tennyson Drive Stormwater Management Infrastructure Project will address localized flooding during significant storm events and allow stormwater from the drainage basin to collect and direct runoff to the ravine located near Standish Place, southeast of the Tennyson Drive area of concern that currently experiences flooding.





#### **Little Free Libraries**
