#### Brown Deer Road Construction Update

The Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District contractor has begun constructing a new sewer thus closing Brown Deer Road at Regent Road and at Rexleigh Drive, this past Monday. Access to the Bayside Garden Center and the residences along this section of road will be from the east side of Brown Deer Road.

The marked detour route for those traveling eastbound is Port Washington Road to Green Tree Road to Lake Drive and the reverse for those traveling west bound.

The project includes construction of a 27inch sewer that will be installed using underground tunneling methods. Large shafts, which look like big holes, are used to lower tunneling equipment

underground. The project will be under construction through July 2023.


