Yard Waste Collection Next Week

The next full yard waste collection will be conducted the week of May 1.

- Yard waste must be out before 7am on Monday, May 1st to ensure your items will be picked up.
- Yard waste must be at least 3 feet away from mailboxes and other structures, branches must be less



- than 5' long, branches must be parallel to the road, and cannot be in plastic bags.
- Yard waste should be placed in bags or containers if possible.
- If your pile is greater than 10' long x 5' wide x 5' high, you will need a special pick-up which can be requested here.

Adopt-A-Tree Deadline MAY 5

The Adopt-A-Tree program is back with two options in 2023.

Option 1: Public Right-of-Way Trees

 The cost per tree is \$200, and includes 1 tree, planting in public right-of-way, mulching, & initial watering.

Option 2: Private Property Trees

 The cost per tree is \$225, and only includes the tree. Trees can be planted on private property.

In the continued effort to maintain a 5% species threshold and to diversify the Village's tree population, the following trees will be available this year:

- Japanese Tree Lilac
- Imperial Honeylocust
- Exclamation Planetree
- · American Sweetgum

No Mow May is a conservation initiative that encourages people to stop mowing or mow less often for the month of May to create habitat and provide resources for bees and other early-season pollinators. The Village of Bayside is proud to join a number of other municipalities in the No Mow May initiative.

During the month of May, Bayside will suspend enforcement of long-grass rules, allowing property owners to delay or reduce lawn cutting to promote pollinator-friendly habitat early in the growing season. Participating residents must register their properties.

2023 Assessments

The Village of Bayside performs a revaluation of all property annually. This means all property within the Village will be reviewed then assessed to fair market value annually. Your assessed value can increase or decrease each year depending on current market conditions. The fair market value of all property is calculated by reviewing arm's length sales, which are valid sales between a willing seller and a willing buyer on the open market. Assessors may also consider information from other sources to determine your assessment. Full value assessments ensure that your property value mirrors fair market value annually. If the market for similar property decreases, your value will decrease to match what the market value is reflecting.

For those property owners where values will change in 2023, you will receive a change of assessment letter in early May. Open book, which is a time for all property owners to meet with the assessor as well as ask questions and discuss their current assessment, is a conference, either face-to-face or over the phone, with the assessor to discuss the value of your property. Open book will be held by phone and virtually May 5 – June 20 by appointment. In addition, an in-person open book will be held on May 23 from 1 to 3 pm at Village Hall. Board of Review, which functions like court and is required to evaluate evidence based on facts, will be held on June 27, beginning at 6 pm at Village Hall. DURING AN INSPECTION WE...

- 1. Bring up a photo and sketch of your property to ensure we are at the correct location.
- 2. Look over the current property conditions in our database.
- 3. Review the notes on the property to prepare for our visit.
- 4. Look for permits in the windows or on the property.
- 5. Knock or ring the doorbell as we approach. Leave a door tag if no one is there.
- 6. Explain why we are visiting; remodel, new construction, permit.
