




#### **Bayside Beer Gardens Are Back!**

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is continuing work on the 14 mile, I-43 North-South reconstruction project, between Silver Spring Drive and WIS 60 (Washington Street), in Milwaukee and Ozaukee counties.

The following work is scheduled to take place as part of the County Line Road/Port Washington Road Interchange Segment.


#### Beginning Monday May 15:

#### Local Access Route:


Residents along the east Road will need to access their property through the work zone.



#### **Well Abandonment Grant Program**

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is now accepting application for the new American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Well Compensation and Well Abandonment Grant Program. The DNR will accept applications until funding runs out.

The new programs will provide \$10 million in financial assistance to well owners to address contamination in their wells by awarding grants for the replacement, reconstruction, treatment, or abandonment of their well.



#### 2023 Assessments

For those property owners where values will change in 2023, change of assessment letters have been mailed. Open book, which is a time for all property owners to meet with the assessor as well as ask questions and discuss their current assessment, is a conference, either face-to-face or over the phone, with the assessor to discuss the value of your property. Open book will be held by phone and virtually May 5 – June 20 by appointment. In addition, an in-person open book will be held on May 23 from 1 to 3 pm at Village Hall. Board of Review, which functions like court and is required to evaluate evidence based on facts, will be held on June 27, beginning at 6 pm at Village Hall. Visit the Village web site for more information.

The Village performs a revaluation of all property annually. This means all property within the Village will be reviewed then assessed to fair market value annually. Your assessed value can increase or decrease each year depending on current market conditions. The fair market value of all property is calculated by reviewing arm's length sales, which are valid sales between a willing seller and a willing buyer on the open market. Assessors may also consider information from other sources to determine your assessment. Full value assessments ensure that your property value mirrors fair market value annually. If the market for similar property decreases, your value will decrease to match what the market value is reflecting.

The Village has an average community assessment value change of 11.16% for 2023. ## **MAY 5th - JUNE 20th**

The Open Book period will last for 1 month. During this time, if you have questions about your assessment, you may set an appointment to review your new value with the assessor.

# WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

## **Q OPEN BOOK**

Open book is a period of time to discuss your new value with an assessor.

The **open book process** starts as soon as you receive your notice and ends before the Board of Review, usually **30 to 45 days**.

You can set an appointment for an open book on our website, accurateassessor.com, by **simply clicking** 

Appointment.

Your open book meeting with an assessor lasts about 15 minutes.

You can share recent appraisals, realtor opinions of value, and recent sales. The assessor will also share their sales analysis and show how we came to your new value.

## **Q ROLL VIEWING**

Roll viewing is a 2-hour period to view a printed copy of the roll at Village Hall.

A roll book is a listing of all properties and their assessed values. The roll viewing is the official opening of the roll, a requirement by the Wisconsin Department of Revenue.

The roll book is accessible 24/7 on our website, accurateassessor.com by simply clicking Roll Books.


The roll viewing is meant for those property owners without access to the internet. If you want to speak to an assessor about your value, you can set an open book appointment and talk with an assessor at your convenience!

# What's A Mill Rate?

The Mill Rate is calculated by dividing the total taxes needed by the total assessment value of the community. An increase in assessed value does not equate to an increase in your taxes.
