### YARD WASTE REMINDERS

- Place your pile or bags by the road, three feet away from mailboxes and other structures.
- Branches must be less than 6 inches in diameter and 5 feet long.
- Arrange sticks parallel to the road.
- Do not put yard waste in plastic bags, garbage carts, or recycling carts.
- Do not put pet waste, dirt, sod, concrete, plastic planter containers in yard waste piles, bags, or reusable containers.
- Do not place yard waste on a property other than your own.
- Combine all materials into one (1) pile per property.
- Piles greater than 250 cubic feet require a special pick-up.
- Contractor generated yard waste is not collected by the Village. Please make sure your contractor takes yard waste with them when done.
- Crews will pass by each home once. If you miss the yard waste collection, you can request a special pickup for a fee.
- Yard waste can be dropped off on Recycling and Clean-Up Days.



### FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Fall leaf collection will begin the fourth Monday of October. At this time, you can place loose leaves roadside. Please do not place loose leaves roadside until the weekend prior to collection.

- Please set leaves roadside out of the ditch and not in the road for pickup.
- Please have all loose leaves consolidated into one pile per property.
- Leaves should not be put in bags for collection during loose-leaf season. If leaves are bagged, they will be picked up only on yard waste collection weeks.
- Place material away from mailboxes or other structures so that it may be easily accessible. Do not mix leaves with other yard waste, such as branches or twigs.
- Please keep all leaves out of the ditch and culvert area; this will help during the wet fall and spring season.
- Open burning of leaves is prohibited.

### PREPARE FOR WINTER

Winter is around the corner meaning snow and cold weather will be arriving as well.

#### Prepare Yourself

- Stay indoors during a storm.
- Walk carefully on snowy, icy walkways.
- Avoid overexertion when shoveling snow. It's a serious workout and going at it too hard may bring on a heart attack, a major cause of death in the winter. If you must shovel snow, stretch before going outside.
- Stay dry. Wet clothing loses its insulating value and transmits the cold rapidly.

#### Prepare Your Home

- Clean gutters, disconnect and drain all outside hoses. If possible, shut off outside water valves.
- Insulate walls and attics, and caulk and weather-strip doors and windows.
- Repair roof leaks and remove tree branches that could get weighted down with ice or snow, potentially falling on your or your neighbor's house.
- Wrap water pipes in your basement or crawl spaces with insulation sleeves to slow heat transfer.
- Consider an insulated blanket for your hot water heater.
- If you have a fireplace, keep the flue closed when you're not using it.
- Make sure your furniture isn't blocking your home's heating vents.
- During cold spells, keep cabinet doors open to allow warm air to circulate around pipes, particularly those in the kitchen and bathrooms.

- Keep a slow trickle of water flowing through faucets connected to pipes that run through unheated or unprotected spaces.
- If your house will be unattended during cold periods, consider draining the water system.
- Avoid ice dams, where water from melted snow refreezes in the gutters and seeps in under the roof, soaking interior walls. Here's how:
  - Ventilate your attic.
  - Insulate the attic floor well to minimize the amount of heat rising through the attic within the house.
  - Consider having a water-repellent membrane installed under your roof covering.

#### Prepare Your Car

- Drive only when absolutely necessary. If you must drive, travel during the day.
- Don't travel alone. Keep others informed of your schedule.
- Stay on main roads and avoid back road shortcuts.
- Top off antifreeze, windshield wiper fluid, gas, oil, and other fluids.
- Make sure your tires have enough tread. Consider snow tires.
- Keep bagged salt or sand in the trunk for extra traction and to melt ice.
- Clear snow from the top of the car, headlights, and windows.
- Save the numbers for your auto club, insurance agent, and towing service in your cell phone.
- Keep a cold-weather kit in your trunk that includes a blanket or sleeping bag, gloves, hard candy, bottled water, folding shovel, first aid kit, flashlight, and cell phone charger.

### NATIONAL DRUG DROP-OFF DAY

The Drug Enforcement Administration has announced that National Prescription Drug Take Back Day will be held on Saturday, October 28 from 10am-2pm, aiming to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of medications. Unwanted and unused drugs will be collected in the Bayside Police Department Lobby.
