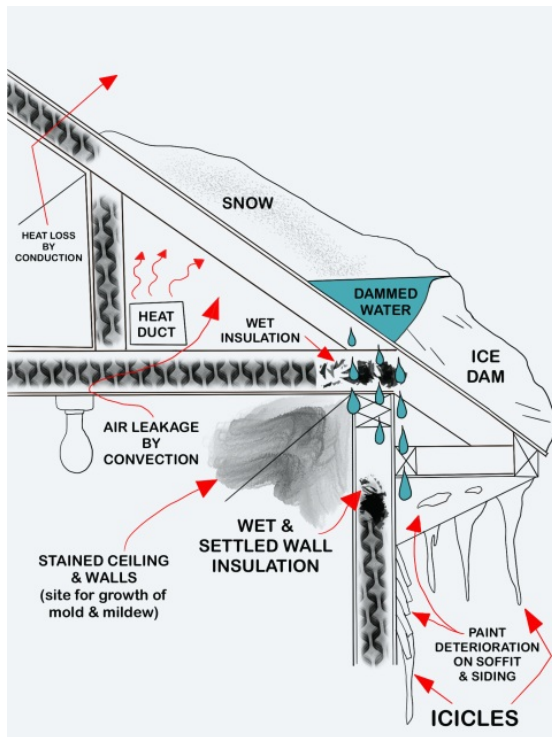

Prevent Ice Dams

It's that time of year! Prevent damage that results from ice dams.

What is an Ice Dam?

An ice dam is a ridge of ice that forms at the edge of a roof and prevents melting snow (water) from draining off the roof. The water that backs up behind the dam can leak into a home and cause damage to walls, ceilings, insulation, and other areas.

With the anticipated rain in the forecast next week, the damages have the potential to be even greater. Avoid ice dams by removing snow from the roof.

Sign Up for Public Safety Emergency Alerts

The Bayside Public Safety Dispatch Center utilizes an emergency notification system, CodeRED, which allows North Shore Public Safety Departments to send emergency notifications to subscribers via email, text and phone calls.

In case of an emergency, individuals within the effected geographic area will be notified via text, phone, or email. There is no need to sign up for life-threatening emergency alerts.

Be A Hydrant Hero

In an emergency, every second counts. Help the Fire Department be able to respond quickly by:

- Removing any snow and ice from the hydrant
- Clearing a wide enough perimeter to walk around it (3 feet)
- Clearing a path from the hydrant to the street



Mount Bayside is Open!

With the recent snow, Mount Bayside has been a popular attraction! Please park in the sled hill parking lot, immediately to the west of the sled hill, or in the Village Hall parking lot.

To ensure emergency access throughout the Village, please do not park on Village streets near the sled hill.



Anti-Icing Brine Application

You may notice white lines on streets in Bayside. What is it? Streets are being treated with anti-icing brine.

This saltwater solution is sprayed onto dry pavement, leaving behind a striped pattern on the roadway when the liquid dries. This treatment helps prevent the formation of ice on the road during cold weather and prevents ice from bonding to the road surface during snowfall events. Brine treated surfaces are less likely to become slippery and require less rock salt to achieve the same result during a snow event.

Anti-icing brine is a cost-effective tool to help keep roadways safe and reduce salt pollution in our soils and waterways.

New Bike Repair Station

Thank you to our generous community member who donated a bike repair station to the Village. The station comes from and

What is FOG?

Fat, Oils and Greases (FOG) are the enemy of a sewer system. When FOG is dumped down the drain, it forms large, thick grease balls that clog pipes. Clogged pipes can result in sewer backups and spills, create environmental problems, cause traffic tie-ups or even flood homes and businesses.

Do's

- Can the grease! Keep an empty metal can and pour oil and grease into the can. Allow grease to cool in the container before throwing it in the trash.
- Wipe before washing. For greasy pans, pour the grease into a container and use a paper towel to wipe out the remaining grease in the pan prior to washing.
- Seal the oil. Liquid should be limited to no more than one-half gallon. Mix liquid vegetable oil with an

absorbent material such as kitty litter or coffee grounds in a sealable container before throwing it in the trash.

- Keep drains clean by pouring 1/2 cup of baking soda down the drain followed by 1/2 cup of white vinegar. Wait 10-15 minutes and then rinse with hot water.

Don'ts

- Don't pour fat, oil or grease down drains or garbage disposals.
- Don't use hot water to rinse grease off cookware, utensils, dishes or surfaces.
- Don't forget to protect the sewer lines from the bathroom: the toilet is not a trash can.
