Bedford City Council met in a Work Session at Bedford City Hall on Tuesday, July 5, 2016 at 6:03 p.m.

Present: Council Members: Walter Genutis, Sandy Spinks, Greg Pozar, Don Saunders, Paula Mizsak, Mayor Stan Koci Marilyn Zolata. Absent: None. Administration: City Manager Michael Mallis, Finance Director Frank Gambosi, Law Director John Montello, Clerk of Council Lorree Villers. Also in attendance: Beth Housiaux-Steward, 93 Avalon Avenue, Rebecca Widowski, State Auditor's Office, Julie D'Aloiso, Spidercat Marketing Inc. and Building Commissioner Calvin Beverly.

Mr. Gambosi introduced Rebecca Widowski from the State Auditor's Office. Ms. Widowski presented the State Auditor's Award to Mr. Gambosi and the City. She explained there were 58,000 entities in Ohio and only 5% received this award. Mr. Gambosi thanked the Finance Department and the other departments on working diligently together in financial reporting. The City was awarded the Ohio Auditor of State Award with Distinction from Auditor of State, Dave Yost. The award was presented to the City for excellence in financial reporting for the City's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for 2015. The award was for exemplary reporting served as the standard for clean, accountable government, representing the highest level of service to Ohioans.

Council had no changes to the minutes of the Work Session and the Regular Meeting of June 6, 2016.

#### DISCUSSION OF SPIDERCAT MARKETING INC. ONLINE NEWS

Mayor Koci requested this topic be placed on the agenda for consideration. Julie D'Aloiso, owner of Spidercat Marketing Inc., was present for questions. The quote before Council for Bedford's costs was in the amount of \$1,500 per month which entailed 3 hours a day Monday through Friday and one (1) hour on the weekend at approximately 20 hours a week or 80 hours a month which was roughly \$18.75 per hour. Discussion was held of ways to try and save money for the monthly services but nothing was determined. The Administration would contact the other three school district communities to see if they were interested in participating in hopes to save money. Mayor Koci thought the schools were interested but he would follow up to make sure. Ms. D'Aloiso explained she assigned reporters to their areas of interest to ensure accurate reporting. Plus, she could also canvas the area for supporters to assist them in costs. A thought was the sponsor's donations should be applied to the \$1,500 monthly fee to offset the City's cost. It was determined the City would revisit the topic next meeting and possibly consider a 6 month trial to see if it was cost effective and to see if the news was getting out to the residents, businesses and surrounding communities.

ORDINANCE NO. 9389-16 AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SECTION 133.22 ENTITLED "APPLICATION OF OVERPAYMENTS AND REFUNDS" OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD, OHIO

Read as a first reading on June 6, 2016, Mr. Gambosi explained any refund that was due to the City from any individual/business from any public monies collected from City Income Tax, water bills, sewer bills, assessments, permits, license fees or any other funds from any service provided by a municipal department or operations, the Finance Director would apply the refund net to any fund or amounts due the City for any other service provided, obligation owed or assessments due the City.

ORDINANCE NO. 9390-16 AN ORDINANCE TO LEVY ASSESSMENTS FOR THE EXPENSE OF GARBAGE/REFUSE COLLECTION, RECYCLING AND DISPOSAL WITHIN THE CITY OF BEDFORD, OHIO DURING THE YEAR 2016

Read as first reading on June 6, 2016, Mr. Gambosi explained this assessment was for the costs for garbage/refuse collection, recycling and disposal which was approximately \$704,000. The assessment could not be in excess of the actual costs for the tax year 2016. The total cost of the above assessments had to be payable in cash within thirty (30) days and the assessments remaining unpaid at the expiration of said thirty (30) day period would be certified to the County Auditor to be placed on the tax duplicate to be assessed and collected on the next tax collection.

ORDINANCE NO. 9396-16 AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE CLERK OF COUNCIL TO DELIVER TO THE CUYAHOGA COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS A PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VI, SECTION 3 (b) OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD REGARDING INITIATIVE, REFERENDUM AND RECALL TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE ELECTORS AT THE NOVEMBER 8, 2016 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Mr. Montello explained Article XIII, Section 4 of the Charter of the City of Bedford provides that Amendments to the Charter may be submitted to the electors of the municipality by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members of Council. The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections has requested that Bedford amends its Charter to streamline filing deadlines in regards to absentee balloting to conform to recent changes in Ohio and Federal Law to allow more preparation. The changes were as follows: If however, an election is held for the recall of more than three (3) members of Council, candidates to succeed them for their unexpired terms shall be voted upon at the same election and shall be nominated by petitions dated and verified in the manner required for petitions presenting names of candidates for regular Municipal elections and similar in form to such petitions and filed with the election authorities at least seventy five (75) days prior to such recall election, but no such nominating petition shall be signed or circulated until such recall petition has been certified to Council, and any signatures antedating such time shall not be counted.

ORDINANCE NO. 9397-16 AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE CLERK OF COUNCIL TO DELIVER TO THE CUYAHOGA COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS A PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VI, SECTION 4 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD REGARDING INITIATIVE, REFERENDUM AND RECALL TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE ELECTORS AT THE NOVEMBER 8, 2016 MUNICIPAL ELECTION Mr. Montello explained Article XIII, Section 4 of the Charter of the City of Bedford provides that Amendments to the Charter may be submitted to the electors of the municipality by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members of Council. The Board of Elections has requested that Bedford amends its Charter to streamline filing deadlines in regards to absentee balloting to conform to recent changes in Ohio and Federal Law to allow more preparation. The changes were as follows: Whenever it becomes the duty of Council to call an election by reason of the filing of an initiative or referendum petition, or one for recall, Council shall call an election for the submission of such question, or recall, at the next regular primary or general election occurring not less than forty (40) days ninety (90) days nor more than ninety (90) one hundred twenty (120) days thereafter. If no such regular primary or general election is to be held within such time, Council shall provide for calling a special election not less than forty (40) ninety (90) days nor more than ninety (90) one hundred twenty (120) days thereafter. In either event, Council shall certify its action to the Board of Elections. Provided, however, that if the recall of more than three (3) members of Council is sought by such petition, the period of forty (40) ninety (90) days hereinbefore provided shall be changed to sixty (60) one hundred twenty (120) days.

ORDINANCE NO. 9398-16 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER AND THE CHIEF OF POLICE TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH WOODMERE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR USE OF THE BEDFORD CITY JAIL FACILITIES ("JAIL") Mr. Mallis explained the negotiated contract for the use of our jail with Woodmere Police Department was referenced in Codified Ordinance Section 137.13. The agreement was like the other agreements.

ORDINANCE NO. 9399-16 AN ORDINANCE TO LEVY ASSESSMENTS FOR BEDFORD'S CRIMINAL ACTIVITY NUISANCE ORDINANCE IN THE CITY OF BEDFORD, OHIO Mr. Mallis explained these individuals were notified and failed to pay as stated in Codified Section 511.12. The City continued to experience repeat offenders for criminal activities.

ORDINANCE NO. 9400-16 AN ORDINANCE TO LEVY ASSESSMENTS FOR BEDFORD'S FALSE ALARMS ORDINANCE IN THE CITY OF BEDFORD, OHIO

Mr. Mallis explained these individuals were notified and failed to pay as stated in Codified Ordinance Section 747.01. The owner of Eight-Seven LLC said he did not get the first three notices but received the notice from the Finance Department dated in June, 2016. The City had been responding to this particular business since 2012 for numerous false alarms. It was determined the Exhibit would be amended to remove former Mayor Joe Migliorini's assessed costs since 2012.

ORDINANCE NO. 9401-16 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 9342-15 MAKING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENDITURES OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD, OHIO DURING THE YEAR 2016

Mr. Gambosi explained the following were the reasons for the increase or decrease in appropriation requests: General Fund: The increases in appropriations for 2016 in the general fund was due mostly to Police employees paid to perform other duties charged to personnel accounts and the funds were available in the SECC other account in Police Department \$18,000 estimated for 2016. Municipal Court expenditures will need more appropriations due to a major claim in 2016. Fund 200 CDBG Fund: To allow expenditure of taxes on homes 775 Lincoln and demolishing 24 Oakwood. Fund 205 SEALE Narcotics Fund: To allow expenditure of LEF Grant and additional Funds in 2016/2017 per grant. Fund 210 Law Enforcement Trust Fund: To allow expenditure of confiscated funds over past years to be used by Police Department according to Ohio Revised Code in the amount of \$45,000. Fund 213 Grants Fund: Heightened Enforcement grants have been received and spent during 2016 and funds need appropriation to coincide with revenue received. Community Diversion received fees of \$300 for use by the department. The Recreation Department received donations of \$530 for soccer and baseball and football use. Fund 500 Water Fund: Increase in appropriation is to pay for water meter bonds issue costs in 2016 \$296,807.

ORDINANCE NO. 9402-16 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO NEGOTIATE A LEASE CONTRACT WITH SBA STRUCTURES, LLC FOR AN EASEMENT AGREEMENT OF A CELLULAR TOWER SITE AT BEDFORD MUNICIPAL CENTER IN THE CITY OF BEDFORD

Mr. Mallis explained the lease was a two year negotiation regarding a proposed acquisition of an easement from SBA Structures, LLC for an exclusive term communications easement and assignment of the existing ground lease located at the cellular tower site at Bedford Municipal Center. Per the agreement the City would receive a buyout of \$950,000, any technology added to the tower the City would receive 50% of the revenue for the next 50 years and SBA Structures, LLC would have to maintain the tower for any repairs.

ORDINANCE NO. 9403-16 AN ORDINANCE ENACTING SECTION 549.20 ENTITLED "FLYING MODEL AIRCRAFT" OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD Mr. Mallis explained the Chief of Police recommended that the City regulate the use of Flying Model Aircraft, including drones, due to their rising popularity and obvious safety issues to the residents. Mr. Genutis questioned why the drone aircraft was under "Weapons and Explosives" in the Codified Ordinances. He read:

- (a) No person shall operate, within the city limits of Bedford, any model aircraft, unmanned aircraft system (UAS), or drone which is controlled by radio, electronic, or similar free flight operation, by a person on the ground or otherwise, in a manner that the aircraft flies over or within 1,000 feet of any of the following:
- (1) Public or private school property, without written expressed consent, such as athletic facilities, school buildings, and transportation facilities
  - (2) All city owned buildings, without the express written consent of the city
  - (3) Any public utility location such as water, sewer, electric, phone, or gas

- (4) Active crime scenes
- (5) Active fire or accident scenes
- (6) Communications tower
- (b) Sustained operation above any roadway is prohibited where such operation could impair a driver's line of sight, distract drivers, or come into contact with motor vehicles operating within said roadways.
- (c) Operation to view or capture images of people on private property or to view or capture images of private property that would otherwise not be visible without the use of any model aircraft, unmanned aircraft system (UAS), or drone is prohibited. Operation of any model aircraft, unmanned aircraft system (UAS), or drone that causes a property owner to believe they or their property is being viewed or imaged or is harassing in nature is prohibited.
- (d) Operation before dawn and after dusk is prohibited.
- No person shall equip any model aircraft, unmanned aircraft system (UAS), or drone with any weapon such as a firearm, explosive device, incendiary device, ballistic knife, knife, zip gun or any other dangerous ordinance as described in sections 2923.11 or 2923.24 of the Ohio Revised Code or any device that is expressly excepted from the definition of a destructive device pursuant to the "Gun Control Act of 1968," 82 Stat. 1213, 18 U.S.C. 921(a)(4), as amended, and regulations issued under this act.
- (f) Law enforcement officers are exempt when operated in the course of their duty.
- (g) No person shall fly any model aircraft, unmanned aircraft system (UAS), or drone which is controlled by radio, electronic, or similar free flight operation, within the city limits of Bedford, without first registering the device with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) as required by FAA guidelines. Any person operating any model aircraft, unmanned aircraft system (UAS), or drone must have in their possession any required FAA registration certificate for the specific model aircraft, unmanned aircraft system (UAS), or drone being operated.

He was totally against letter "f"; he felt it should be removed. He suggested this issue be discussed in more detail before consideration. Mr. Mallis added as far as the military was concerned it didn't really matter what laws Bedford had on their books; the military would do what they wanted to do regardless. Council would read this tonight as a first reading.

ORDINANCE NO. 9404-16 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 9286-15 CHAPTER 747.01 ENTITLED "FALSE ALARMS" OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BEDFORD

Mr. Mallis explained there continued to be numerous false alarms called in which the Police Department and/or Fire Department were required to respond. The false alarms were not only a public nuisance but also a threat to public safety by diverting limited police and fire resources from legitimate requests for assistance and other law enforcement and fire protection matters. The idea was to encourage security alarm users and alarm system monitoring companies to maintain the operational reliability and proper use of security alarm systems in order to reduce unnecessary Police Department and/or Fire Department responses to false alarms. The Police Chief requested the warning letter be mailed by regular mail/US Postal service and the bills be mailed certified mail.

ORDINANCE NO. 9405-16 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 9358-16 PASSED JANUARY 19, 2016 ESTABLISHING PAY RANGES AS SUBSEQUENTLY AMENDED Mr. Mallis and Mr. Gambosi explained the changes were under the City Manager's section of the pay ordinance for the Part Time Receptionist/Office Clerk at a starting range of \$10.00-15.00 per hour with a maximum of \$20.00 per hour. The other position was for an Interim Purchasing Clerk at an additional

\$3.00 plus rate per hour. It was determined this topic would be discussed in executive session this evening. (See attached 2013 minutes, memo and union contract verbiage)

# DISCUSSION OF URGING CUYAHOGA COUNTY TO RECONSIDER ITS DECISION TO CLOSE THE SOUTHGATE NEIGHBORHOOD FAMILY SERVICE CENTER

Mr. Genutis requested this topic be placed on the agenda for discussion because he felt Bedford should consider a Resolution urging Cuyahoga County to reconsider its decision. Discussion was held that some of the surrounding cities were not in support of keeping the service in Maple Heights for various unstated reasons. It was determined Bedford passing a Resolution would not change the outcome so maybe it was best not too since the issue was moot.

City Manager Michael Mallis explained the City would be "sounding" the water system in August to attempt to find water leaks. The City currently had a 40% loss in water costs. Dominion continued the gas line project as they work closely with the Service Department. The Columbus Road Bridge would open ahead of schedule in July. Another demolition would be happening at 24 Oakwood Avenue soon. He urged the residents to get involved and stay informed with City business. Budget cuts would continue to happen to bring the numbers in line. He announced the Plein Air Art and Classic Car Show on Saturday, July 16th 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

No reports from Law Director John Montello and Councilman Genutis.

Finance Director Frank Gambosi thanked Mr. Mallis and Mr. Montello for their efforts regarding the acquisition of an easement from SBA Structures, LLC for an exclusive term communications easement and assignment of the existing ground lease located at the cellular tower site at Bedford Municipal Center; it was a two year negotiation. He thanked Jean King for serving on the Assessment Equalization and Local Municipal Income Tax Board.

Councilwoman Zolata thanked everyone for their efforts. She was pleased with Robert Martel and Shaun Stanton for graduating from the Police Academy as Patrolmen. She thanked her son Larry for bringing her to the meeting.
