Our team has been communicating regularly and receiving updates from the County Emergency Management Offices, FEMA, Mayors and Managers Association, Cleveland Clinic Officials, Gov. DeWine's office and others. As a result of these discussions and updates, the City of Bedford continues to make decisions as it pertains to upcoming programming, events, meetings, and services. This page has been created to provide residents and business owners links to relevant news and information regarding coronavirus/COVID-19 and resources that may be available to assist those in need. Our staff continues to add information as it becomes available. As this situation continues to change, information will be updated on the City's website and social media platforms.

Please know, the City continues to perform all essential functions, including our first responders and public works. Rest assured, our Police and Fire Department staff will continue to serve and support our community. The health and safety of our residents, businesses and staff is of the upmost importance. Due to the current health crisis, City Hall and other municipal buildings will remain closed through June 1, 2020. However, all of our staff remain available by phone or email and we are encouraging City business be conducted in this manner and online. We will continue to evaluate the fiscal impact of COVID-19 and take appropriate measures to continue providing the best service to our residents and business community.

While it seems all of our attention has been focused on the COVID-19 situation, I want to take a minute and share some exciting news taking place in Bedford as we move into spring.

- The Bedford Fire Department recently took delivery of and placed in service a new Advanced Life Support Rescue Squad. The squad will serve as the primary rescue squad in our fleet and is equipped with all of the latest safety features. In addition, the Department will also be taking delivery of an new engine which should go into service by mid-May.
- Our Service Department is taking the necessary steps towards starting the 2020 Road Program and a Sewer Maintenance Program which was made available through a \$150,000.00 grant from Cuyahoga County.
- Bedford's second Cuyahoga County Healthy Tree Canopy Grant Program trees were delivered and will be planted in the coming weeks. 100 new trees will be planted where Ash trees infected with Emerald Ash disease were removed from tree lawns.
- The City was awarded an additional \$50,000.00 which will go towards completing a new sign initiative that involves updating and increasing signage throughout Bedford.

The Administration assisted Art of Beauty in acquiring necessary federal approvals allowing the Bedford business to begin manufacturing a hand sanitizer product. This product is now being used locally by our Police, Fire and Service Departments.

Again, thank you for your cooperation, understanding, partnership and for being a good neighbor during these unprecedented times. It is through challenges that we are reminded what is most important – how we treat people. Please check on your friends and neighbors and continue to practice social distancing. Through continuing to demonstrate thoughtfulness, cooperation and kindness, we will come out of this time stronger.


